The content these services have access to always changes when they close new deals, so you're not stuck with the same options month after month. Many of those series, such as Netflix's House of Cards and Orange is the New Black, have received rave reviews. There are a number of limited options for streaming online that are both legal and free. Crackle is a website that offers movies and TV shows to stream for free, but it's supported by ads and you'll end up seeing about as many commercials as you'd watch programming on cable. The amount of content Crackle offers is also slimmer than the subscription services, because the site doesn't have the financial muscle to make giant content purchases like the larger sites, so it might be harder to find your favorite movie. The downside of an online streaming service is that you are at the mercy of the content the company has to offer; you don't just have a movie under the sun and guaranteed to be able to view it. You don't own the movies either, so if Netflix loses your favorite movie, you won't be able to watch it. One way to own movies and watch online to download them. Whether you're a Google or Apple fan, both iTunes and the Google Play Store offer movies to buy through those accounts that become yours to own. New releases cost about \$20; about the same price that a DVD would cost, although a digital copy cannot be lost or damaged. Additional guides The major players Sony Crackle, Crackle or Crackle Plus Once known as Crackle, this free streaming site has undergone almost as many name changes as P. Diddy. Initially controlled by Sony, it is now a joint venture between Sony and Chicken Soup for the Soul Entertainment (CSS). That collaboration created a new entity called Crackle Plus, and it was believed that this would also become the name of the streaming service. However, a look at the site and it is clear that simplicity has won: It is simply called crackle. Whatever you call it, the service includes content from six ad-supported CSS streaming services (Popcornflix, Popcornflix Kids, Popcornflix Comedy, Frightpix, Españolflix and Trufl), as well as some Sony movies and TV shows. You'll find some quality low-budget hits like Election, Bernie, Coneheads, and Train to Busan, and generous smattering of obscure-but-interesting B-movies. Crackle is a great resource, although constant interruptions from advertisers can get old pretty quickly. The The is offered in 21 countries, but has shut down its Canadian, Latin American and Australian offerings. IMDb TV Newer to this roundup is the Amazon-owned IMDb TV (formerly known as Freedive). It has free, ad-supported TV shows and movies. In February 2020, the service acquired the rights to more than 20 Disney series, including Lost, Desperate Housewives, Malcolm in the Middle and My So-Called Life. It's also the only site that lets you stream Lost and Malcolm for free in the middle. Other TV shows in the relatively small library include Psych, White Collar, 3rd Rock From the Sun and Schitt's Creek. It has a number of hit films including the Hunger Games series, Groundhog Day, Isle of Dogs, Big Fish, Rudy, Glory, and many more award winners and cult classics. You watch IMDb TV on the web, Amazon Fire devices and Apple TV, and through the Amazon Prime app that you find on many smart TVs, tablets and phones. IMDb TV is US-only for now, although a European expansion is in the works. Vudu Walmart-owned Vudu might be better known for its subscription streaming service, but the platform also has an impressive and free ad-supported content section. Titles like Ella Enchanted, The Preacher's Wife and The Hungover Games are good examples of what you'll find. If you're cruising through the site's selection of 4K/HDR titles, there are even one or two free-to-watch options. You still need a Vudu account, but you need to create one for free. The Vudu app is already supported by numerous platforms, including Roku, Apple TV, game consoles and more. In addition, there is an app for most mobile devices. Vudu is only available in the U.S. How is this for a good deal: Sign up for a library card and get free downloads or streams of movies, without ads. That's the deal when you use Hoopla, a digital media streaming platform that works with local libraries to give members online access to de learnable content. It is similar to Overdrive, but with more than just e-books and audiobooks. The availability of a particular title will depend on your location and the number of copies available for download, but we found some surprisingly decent movies when we checked in October 2020. Streaming works on any device with a browser, while downloads require the Hoopla app on a mobile device. Not every library currently supports Hoopla, so make sure you ask. So far, libraries in the US and Canada have access to Hoopla. YouTube This one is a no-brainer. Everyone knows YouTube is the biggest video hosting service online, and you probably already use the site for silly cat videos and images of people getting hit with exercise balls. But YouTube has a large collection of movies at its free level as well. Granted, the majority of these are B-list novelties, but there are a few quality movies hiding in there. Besides Free, Google-curated movies, there are thousands of movies on the site that won't appear unless you search for them directly. If you're looking for a particular title, especially an older one, it's worth quickly searching YouTube to see if anyone posted it. These are not always uploaded by the rights holders of the film, and many of them are divided into episodes and playlists, but as they say, beggars cannot be chosen. Finding free movies on YouTube has gotten harder lately, as more rights holders choose to offer their movies for hire through the service, and YouTube also has subscription tiers such as YouTube Premium and its live TV streaming service, YouTube TV. Still, you'll find plenty to watch, especially if your standards aren't too high regarding the quality of the stream. Vimeo YouTube is arguably the biggest video hosting site, but Vimeo is probably the best. Yes, they are fighting words, but Vimeo has the strength to support them. The Roku channel When Roku initially launched its free, ad-supported Roku channel, it technically didn't qualify for this roundup because you had to have one of the company's streaming media devices to see it. Roku devices certainly won't break the bank, but they are not free. Now, however, the Roku channel is available to everyone, via the web, but also through the company's free apps for iOS and Android. The service has more than 10,000 titles to choose from, including old favorites such as The Sisterhood of the Traveling Pants and Donnie Darko, as well as a number of new and old TV series, from The Dick Van Dyke Show and Bewitched to The Bachelorette. You need to create a free Roku account before you look, but that's a quick and painless process. If you ever decide to expand your choices, the Roku channel is now home to several premium subscription options, including Showtime, Epix, and Starz. The Roku channel is available in the US and Canada. Plex Free Movies and TV shows Plex is best known as a versatile and easy way to manage and view your private collection of movies, music, photos and other media. In 2019 however, the company has its own free streaming service with ads featuring a collection of movies and TV shows from studios such as MGM, Warner, Lionsgate and Legendary. It is available worldwide, available, title selection will vary greatly by region. Pluto TV Although it may not be as well known as the above services, Pluto TV is still worthy of your attention. Not only does it host free movies on-demand, but it is also a free live TV streaming service, hosting content compiled from all over the web. While the channels vary enormously, here we are focused on the movies. Pluto TV currently has multiple live movie channels, perfect if you want to watch something, but don't know what. There are two general purpose film channels, with the rest focusing on specific genres or categories, including Action movies, Flicks of Fury, Horror 24/7, Classic Movies, Black Cinema, Gravitas Movies and The Asylum. The service operates in the US, as well as many international locations. Pluto TV's on-demand film library is relatively small and runs frequently, but offers as much variety as the live movie channels. It is also available on a ton of devices in addition to your computer, including Apple TV, Amazon Fire TV, Roku devices, and more. For more information on Pluto TV, see our full guide to the service. Tubi TV Another up-and-comer, Tubi is very similar to Sony Crackle, in that it offers both free movies and TV episodes. No matter what device you're using, chances are you'll watch Tubi pretty much because it's available on Android, iOS, Roku, Apple TV, Amazon Fire TV, Samsung Smart TVs, Sony Smart TVs, PlayStation 4, Xbox One and the web. As with the vast majority of services on this list, you should look at a few commercials, but that's what keeps the service free. Tubi has content from more than 200 partners, including NBCUniversal and Warner Bros., which brings with it nearly 400 classic titles, including Hell's Kitchen, Unsolved Mysteries, 3rd Rock From the Sun and The Real McCoys, and the original version of 21 Jump Street. Hit films such as Kick-Ass, Fury and 13 Going On 30 are there, as well as cult classics such as 30 Days of Night, Donnie Darko and The Boondock Saints. Cult classics such as Assault on Precinct 13, Sleepaway Camp, and C.H.U.D., along with soon-to-be cult classics such as 10 Cloverfield Lane and No Country for Old Men, can also be found in the growing catalog. If you use this service to supplement Netflix instead of replacing it, you can't use it on Netflix and find interesting movies to watch. Independent and documentary films Kanopy Like Hoopla, Kanopy is not only free to but it is also ad-free if you have a library card. Originally founded in 2008 in Australia as an educational tool, Kanopy now offers a library of more than 30,000 films through its partnerships with more than 200 libraries. There's a heavy focus on independent free films and documentaries (the company even has access to many recent films from the A24 catalog), but you'll find all sorts of movies available, and even more are on the way thanks to a deal that will see filmmaker Fred Wiseman's entire catalog come to the service. Kanopy is available internationally, but content may vary by location. Top Documentary Films Love Documentaries? So are we. You know what they say, truth is stranger than fiction. The aptly titled Top Documentary Films is, without a doubt, the best site for documentaries. Not every selection is film-length, but a good documentary doesn't have to be long - some of the best are under the 60-minute mark. With a library of over 3,000 movies, the site also has a simple and simple layout and categorizes all its movies based on the subject, making it easy to find something you're interested in right away. The content is not hosted by the site, but rather composed and embedded from other sites such as YouTube, Vimeo, Daily Motion, etc. It is available internationally, but not all content works in all locations. Sources for classic movies Archive.org Chances are you're reading this article because you're looking for a place to watch newly released movies online. While there is nothing wrong with it, you should definitely not ignore all the fantastic older movies the internet has to offer. Archive.org offers a veritable treasure trove of old movies you've probably never heard of, as well as a handful you'll recognize. The archive - which is also home to the famous Wayback Machine that shows you how the Internet used to be - has silent movies, black and white horror movies, obscure sci-fi movies, and an assortment of other movies. They may not have all the fancy CGI we've all grown so accustomed to, but the occasional throwback is a great way to mix things up. Open Culture Open Culture is designed to be your one-stop shop for all

things free and civilized. The site offers hundreds of free online classes to enroll, thousands of free ebooks to read, and hours after hours of lectures from prominent figures such as Carl Sagan and Leonard Bernstein. It also offers a ton of free movies. Here you'll find everything from silent movies and Hitchcock-helmed projects to Westerns and film noir. The site even houses some early shorts from legends like Quentin Tarantino and Stanley Kubrick. Open Culture can be difficult to navigate, but with over 1,000 free movies available, it's for sure worth the slog. Retrovision Retrovision is another public domain site that classic films from different eras. The word classic might be for interpretation - there are some movies here that were made as recently as last year, and not all of Retrovision's films are of high quality - but there's still plenty of good stuff here. Retrovision is also a well-designed site that allows users to filter based on genre. It is also not limited to movies of long time, as there is a robust collection of classic TV shows to choose from. Shocker Internet Drive-In Shocker Internet Drive-In is a bit niche, and the website looks like it was created in the 90s, but it's a great resource. The site is updated weekly with featured horror classics, which are then made available for free download as WMV files on the snack bar website. The site is a nice little explosion from the past, with weekly impressions framed in a digital drive-in. Users can buy DVD copies of any movie on the website for only \$3. If you miss the old days of the internet when it was more like the Wild West and everything was less polished, this would be for you. The downside of so many different services available is that if you have a movie in mind but don't know where to watch it, you have a lot of different catalogs to wade through in hopes of finding it. Fortunately, as long as you have a smartphone, you probably have access to a tool that can help you. With Apple's TV app, available on iOS and on several other platforms, including Apple TV, Roku, Amazon Fire TV and smart TVs from LG and Samsung, you can search more than 50 different streaming services. For Android users, the Google Play Movies & TV app offers similar functionality, although the number of connected services is smaller. Roku devices now have a Recommended Free section with a curated selection of the best free content on the platform, whether you've installed a specific channel or not. This is in addition to the existing cross-service search, although most of what you find will either be available for purchase or rent or will be on a service that requires a subscription.
