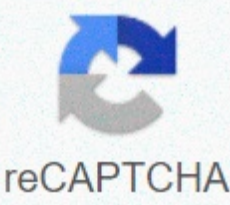

Locate the UAS seating position as specified in the vehicle operating instructions. Some UAS seating may require anchors to be deployed or guides installed. 2. Remove the child seat from the base by pressing the lower release handle located below the centre of the child seat foot and lifting it up on the child seat. (Fig. 25-1) 3. Turn the holder (Fig. 44-1a) and press the red UAS connector release button to remove the connectors from their storage position inside the base (Fig. 44-1b) (Turn these steps around and re-save the UAS connectors). Place the base in the rearward facing position in the forward-facing seat of the vehicle as shown in Figure 45-1. The child must be facing the rear of the vehicle and the child seat must be placed in the forward-facing seat of the vehicle. 4. He has fitted the UAS anchors to the seat of the vehicle. (Fig. 44-2) After placement, slide the UAS connectors of the child seat to the steel rod. Pull the child seat upwards and make sure that the child seat is securely attached to the base. (Fig. 25-1) If the child seat is not handled safely at the base, the child seat will not provide any protection to your child. The child seat contains an indicator of the seat angle at the bottom of the shell on the left side of the child, which helps to achieve the correct angle of folding of the child seat. If the child seat is too folded, excessive force may be exerted when hitting the child's shoulder and neck. The following instructions must be carefully followed to ensure the correct folding angle of the child seat. WARNING 7.0 INSTALLATION 1. Child seat with base: Make sure the vehicle is parked on flat ground. Lock the child seat at the base and check that the child seat in the vehicle seat is straight from side to side. (Fig. 47-1) Check the seat angle indicator that corresponds to your child's weight. • If the seat angle indicator shows no red, the seat is installed at the correct folding level. • If the seat angle indicator shows red, the child seat is either too upright or too folded. If the seat is too upright, extend the leg one position at a time until no red appears. Check the level indicator as shown in fig. • If the seat angle indicator does not show red, the seat is mounted at the correct folding level. • If the seat angle indicator shows red, the child seat is either too upright or too folded. If the child seat is too upright, place the tightly rolled towel or noodles in the car seat under the foot of the child's seat until the level indicator shows red. Make sure that the child seat is firmly installed and secured in the vehicle by performing the following test every time the child seat is used. Push firmly down and side to side on the child seat head to make sure that the vehicle seat belt does not loosen at all and that the vehicle seat belt is very tightly fastened around the child seat/base. If you find that the vehicle seat belt is loose or that the seat is moving or turning downwards easily, read the section entitled Choosing the best position for the child seat to see if the selected position is sufficient and check that you have completed all the steps in the section entitled Securing the child seat or base in the Vehicle. Do not use this seating position unless the child seat remains firmly installed in the vehicle seat 3. After installation in the vehicle, place the handle in the middle or non-swing position. Page 4 OTHER INFORMATION 9.1 Use of the child seat in an aircraft This child seat can be used without a base in the aircraft in the same way as in a car. Please check with the airline in advance to determine their terms and conditions regarding the use of child seats on board the aircraft. The child seat may only be used on the forward-facing aircraft seat. Please ask the flight attendant for help in placing the child seat. Follow these instructions to install correctly and follow the instructions to complete the final safety check. 9.2 Using the Baby Trend child seat with the Baby Trend stroller Please refer to the stroller's operating instructions for information on using the baby seat with the Baby Trend stroller. 9.3 Cleaning and maintenance Hard surfaces of the child seat (plastic parts and metal parts) can be cleaned by wiping with a solution of water with mild soap. Do not use bleach as it may weaken plastic components. Dry all surfaces with a clean towel. The straps may be cleaned on site with a solution of mild soap and water or replaced if they become too dirty. Do not work through the straps as they may be damaged or weakened. The seat can be washed as follows: 1. Remove the shoulder straps from the child seat according to the instructions in the Section Setting the shoulder straps. 2. For a five-point harness, disconnect the shoulder strap from the tie and buckles and leave the buckles in the buckles. Do not forget to remember how they are threaded to help in assembly. 3. For the adjustable rear child seat, carefully remove the headrest fabric and set the adjustable back to the lowest position. Carefully remove the fabric of the saddle. Carefully remove the seat cloth in the seat of the child's fixed rear seat. For five-point harness models, do not separate the lower part of the harness from the child seat. Do not use the child seat without a seat. 4. For care and maintenance, see textile label.5. Proper installation requires you to read and understand the entire operating instructions and operating instructions of the vehicle before placing the child in the child seat. Do not allow others to install or use this child seat unless they fully understand that it is the right use and installation. Improper use of this child seat may result in death or serious injury in the event of an impact, sharp turn or sudden stop. The safety of your child depends on: 1. Choosing the best place in your vehicle for the child seat. Places with active airbags should be avoided. 2. Set the position of the shoulder strap of the harness to the appropriate height for your child. 3. Adjust the length of the harness so that it is snug around your child.4. Fast turns, sudden stops or other crash prevention manoeuvres, as well as impact, can injure your child if they are not properly secured in the seat or if the seat is not properly installed in the vehicle. • There are many different types of vehicles, seat belt systems or other passenger restraint systems that are used today. Accordingly, this guide can only provide instructions for proper installation in your vehicle. In addition to this manual, you must also read and understand the operating instructions of the vehicle, which should deal with the use of child restraints. If your the operating instructions do not deal with the installation of the child seat, please contact your local vehicle dealer or vehicle manufacturer to obtain this information before using this child seat. • Some vehicles have no safe place to install this child seat. In addition, many vehicles do not have seat belt systems that will adequately hold this child seat in the desired position. Full information for the correct safe installation of this child seat can be found in both this operating manual and the vehicle owner's manual. • Never combine this child seat or base with another child seat or base from another manufacturer. If you need an additional base, contact your local retailer or Baby Trend, Inc. and ask him for it. • These child saddles are certified for use in motor vehicles and aircraft and meet all applicable Canadian safety standards for motor vehicles. SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS 3.1 About your child • This child seat is designed and tested to suit the child of a certain height and weight range. The use of a child seat for a child whose weight or height is outside these limits will increase the risk of death or serious injury in the event of an accident. On the warning label on the child seat located on the right side of the child you will find the weight and height limits of your model. It is also indicated on the hand cover. • Children with special needs, such as premature babies, may experience difficulties in using this child seat. The folding angle in this baby seat may not be suitable for children with special needs. Do not leave heavy objects in the seat when not in use. Do not store the seat in the trunk of your car with heavy objects or pressure on the seat from the trunk lid. • After the accident, replace the child seat and base. An accident, even if the accident has become a minor accident, can cause undetectable damage to the child seat or base, which can cause the seat or base to fail in the subsequent accident. If the carrier overturns, your child may suffocate 3.3 On active airbags, never place this child seat where the seat of the vehicle with the active airbag is located. If the Active Air bag inflates, it can hit the child seat with great force, causing death or serious injury to your child. For more information and warnings regarding Active Air airbags and additional restrictions and their correct use with baby seats, please refer to the vehicle's operating instructions. 3.4. Unoccupied child seat • Never leave the child seat or base unsecured in the vehicle. An unsecured seat or base may pass through the vehicle in the event of an accident, sudden stop or sharp turn and cause serious injury to the driver, who may then lose control of the vehicle or passengers. If not in use, remove the seat or base from the vehicle or make sure that both are securely strapped to the vehicle according to these instructions. • The child seat can be very hot if left in direct sunlight. Your child may suffer burns from hot plastic parts. Always check that the child is not in contact with your child before placing the child in the seat. In addition, if the carrier is placed too upright, the child's head can fall forward and cause the child to have difficulty breathing. To avoid death or serious injury by asphyxiation, falls and other hazards: • Always place the supporting structure on a firm and flat surface. Never put on soft or plush surfaces such as bed, blanket, couch, sofa, chairs etc. The carrier has a very high possibility of tipping over if it is placed on a soft or plush surface. • Risk of falling: The baby's movements may be down. Never place the carrier near the edge of high surfaces, such as tables, top, shelves or other raised surfaces. To prevent falls, stay at your fingertips whenever the carrier is not on the floor or on the ground. • The child may strangle loose seat belt straps. Never leave the child in the carrier if the straps are loose or unbuttoned. Always wear seat belts as in these

instructions when the child is in the carrier. • Before lifting the handle carrier, make sure that the handle is firmly secured to its position. The carrier rotates around the unlocked handle and can result in injury to your child. • Strings and cords may cause choking: - DO NOT place objects with a string around the child's neck, such as hood strings, pacifiers, etc. RISK of suffocation: The baby carrier may roll over on soft surfaces and suffocate the child, NEVER laying on beds, sofas or other soft surfaces. WARNING Page 12 15 14 4.0 LOCATION 4.3 Check that the vehicle seat belt is safe to use The child seat is designed to always be firmly installed. The vehicle safety belt shall be capable of maintaining a fixed installation at all times. A number of vehicle safety belt systems have been installed on vehicles which are not safe for use with a child seat seat. Even newer vehicles can have seat belt systems that are not safe to use with a child seat. These systems may look safe, but their mode of operation excludes their use with a child seat. If you are not sure whether the vehicle seat belt is safe to use with a child seat, contact the vehicle manufacturer for further information. Safety belt systems that are not safe for use with a child seat seat: DO NOT use the following types of seat belt systems with a child seat seat. These belt systems are not held by an infant • Never place this child seat in a seating position of a vehicle with an active airbag! Active air bags inflate with great power! An inflating active air bag can strike a child seat with enough force to cause death or serious injury to your child. If your vehicle is equipped with an Active Air airbag on the passenger side, please read the vehicle operating instructions for more information on Active Air airbags and the installation of the child seat. • Do not place this child seat on the rear or side of the vehicle seat. (Fig. 14-1 & 14-2). • Do not use the child seat in a vehicle that has a vehicle seat back that does not open in place. The seat back, which folds forward, shall have a locking mechanism to prevent it from flying forward and hitting the child in the event of a sudden stop or accident. • Please read the vehicle owner's manual to find out the best positioning of the child seat or to see if any places are dangerous for installing the child seat. If you do not have the vehicle operating instructions or the operating instructions do not include the installation of the child seat, please contact the vehicle manufacturer before using the child seat to obtain this information. 4.0 LOCATION Before using the child seat, carefully analyse the operation of the vehicle seat belts. The possibility of screwing the vehicle seat belt over the child seat seat or base does not mean that it is safe to use the vehicle seat belt. Read carefully section on seat belt systems, read the vehicle operating instructions in detail and and all warning labels on your vehicle's seat belt. Your vehicle may require modification or a special seat belt to be safely used with this child seat. This type of seat belt anchors the child seat too far ahead and the child seat will not be safely retained in the vehicle (Fig. 17-1). • DO NOT use a shoulder strap that moves along the track. These systems usually move to surround the passenger when the door is closed. This type of belt system will not adequately hold the child seat. (Fig. 17-2). If you have any of the above seat belt systems, DO NOT use it to secure the child seat in the vehicle. Find a place in the vehicle that has a more suitable seat belt system, as described in the following section. You can also contact the vehicle manufacturer to inquire about the installation of a seat belt system that is suitable for limiting the child seat. Seat safely in place at all times. In addition, the locking clamp provided with this product will not make these belt systems safe. • Do not use the lap belt, which remains loose after installation and is only locked in the event of an impact or sudden stop. These lap belts use an emergency locking retractor and are often found in combination with motorized shoulder straps. Since these belts allow the child seat to move on the seat, the chance of the infant seat being out of the right position in a crash is very high. Therefore, do not use the child seat with this type of seat belt system. For information on how to transfer this seat belt system to a system that is acceptable for use with a child seat seat (Fig. 16-1), refer to the dealer of your vehicle or the operating instructions. • Do not use the abdominal/shoulder belt system if they have a lap belt and shoulder strap at one end of the retractor. This type of seat belt system will not sufficiently retain the child seat seat (Fig. 16-2). • Do not use a seat belt that is attached to the door in any way. Use the locking clamp supplied with the child seat according to the instructions on the 42. See the operating instructions of the vehicle, vehicle, information on securing this style of seat belts. This belt style must be locked to prevent the child seat from moving (Fig. 19-2 & 19-3). Safety belt systems suitable for use with a child seat seat: The following safety belt systems may be used with the child seat seat to comply with all other requirements prescribed in this seating manual, including the seat position, and all instructions given in the vehicle operating instructions. • The lap belt, which is manually adjusted and remains tight when the vehicle is in motion, is suitable for use with a child seat. By pulling the belt over the buckle after fixing the buckle, this type of safety belt is tightened. The central rear seat belt is most often this type of safety belt (Fig. 18-1). • The lap belt, which cannot be extended after fastening, is suitable for use with a child seat. These safety belts often have an automatic safety retractor that allows the belt to be extended, but when switched on, it must be unbuttoned and fully reaped before the belt is extended again (Fig. 18-2). • The combination of belly/shoulder seat belts with a latch that locks the lap belt into position is suitable for use with an infant seat.
