The degree requirements include coursework on specific subjects, such as forensic evidence and constitutional law, as well as training in ethics, psychology, race and ethnic relations. Ray Harrington Of the Criminal Justice Club gives interested students the opportunity to meet criminal justice professionals and participate in demonstrations and mock scenarios. Graduates can continue to work in law enforcement, corrections, forensic science and private security, among other areas. Finally, Pfeiffer University aims to instill leadership, communication and critical thinking skills in all graduates. The East Carolina University Department of Criminal Justice at East Carolina University is exploring all perspectives on crime prevention and improving public safety, both in the U.S. and internationally. Rockingham Community College Rockingham Community College is located on the largest campus of the North Carolina Community College system, over 260 acres and six hiking trails. Rockingham students each year choose 70 degrees (associate applied science) or certificate and diploma programs. The community college also offers three college transfer degrees and four baccalaureate degrees offered along with Winston-Salem State University and Greensboro College. A criminal law subject may be filled in a pre-financing or hire-purchase degree with a criminal law certificate of two years or one year. CJ's technology courses focus on financial crime and computer fraud. Coastal Carolina Community College Location jacksonville, N.C. Coastal Carolina Community College was founded in 1972. Through its outline agreement with the University of North Carolina's Wilmington, associate degree graduates with a cumulative B average are allowed for juniors in UNCW undergraduate programs. More than 50 transfer courses are offered through a military partnership between Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune and Marine Corps Air Station New River. Criminal justice students can enroll in a two-year, 76-credit AAS degree program with CJ technology. Students interested in preparing for entry-level law enforcement jobs can enroll in the CCCC's 19-credit Basic Law Enforcement Training (BLET) program. Wayne Community College Wayne Community College was founded in 1960 as a member of 58 community and technical colleges in Tar Heel State. Currently, about 12,000 undergraduates who can enroll in one of the 69 associate applied science degree programs, 36 diploma programs or more than 80 certificate programs. The Bachelor's AAS degree program in criminal justice technology requires completion of 64 hours, plus a 16-week spring internship with a local law enforcement/criminal justice organization. There are not many differences between curricula from school to school. So, find a school where they're happy with the environment. I think what makes each program unique is what the faculty bring to the table in terms of their scientific knowledge. Our faculty has knowledge of crime, theory, law enforcement, courts, corrections, etc. In addition, our curriculum has a specialty in crime analysis, which mainly uses data to answer researchable questions in the area of criminal justice and criminology. I don't think schools are preparing a student to work in North Carolina. Rather, schools prepare students to work wherever they live. I would tell them to take a course or two and determine whether they enjoy the material and can foresee work in the criminal justice system. Good candidates are those who want to work with people and change the lives of these people.
