How do Scottish rituals function? The Scottish ceremony in each state and city (top of the page) consists of four to 33 degrees dominating. However, this composition is delegated by the Supreme Council of the Southern and West Hemispheres. What is the thirty-third and final degree of Masonic ancient and accepted Scottish consciousness? (top of page) is 33°, an honorary degree otherwise known as the Sovereign Grand Inspectorate. This degree cannot be petitioned as in the previous degree. It is the highest of honour, which can be elected to receive it by those high bodies assembled annually with the Scottish ceremony, which the Masonic Supreme Council of the South and West Hemisphere anciently accepted. What is the Supreme Council of the Southern and West Hemispheres? Ancient Scottish rituals are dominated by the Supreme Council of the 33rd and final degree. The Supreme Council is a body, elects members, and is self-reliant. It charters sub-agencies in cities and states, which are called valleys and the East respectively. These subordinates must observe the statues of the Supreme Council and to observe valid orders, but otherwise autonomous. The hierarchy of all the top committees in the world is the same. The only difference is that it is a separate entity. Most supreme committees have active duty members to 33 members with a classification of sovereign high inspectors. There are top councils with more than 33 members, some less. But each Supreme Council builds on the same masonic doctrine of brotherly love, virtue, spiritual and moral growth and development, and maximum service to God and humanity through faith in the immortality of the soul.
