At the federal level, there is the federal police (Portuguese: Polícia Federal, equivalent to the FBI), the Federal Highway Patrol (Polícia Rodoviária Federal) and the Federal Railway Police (Polícia Ferroviária Federal). At the state level there is the military police (Polícia Militar, a gendarmerie-type force, unlike the military police in many other countries, whose Brazilian counterpart is the Army Police) and the Civilian Police (Polícia Civil). At the city level there is a guarda municipal. When it comes to personnel, military and civilian police are the most important, although in terms of headlines and authority, the federal police focus most of the media attention. [19] The civilian police are responsible for investigating crimes, while the military police are responsible for preventing them, although it is not uncommon to see their activities collide and every now and then they have open confrontations. The civilian police are organized by operations. Scrivener (escrivão) is a inferior position responsible for internal work carried out on police premises (e.g. opinions). The Detective Inspector (detetive) or investigator (investigador) is responsible for activities outside the premises (e.g. investigating the circumstances of the crime). Delegado (delegado, similar to the captain in the United States) is a senior official (required for a law degree), responsible for lower levels and coordinating the entire work (investigations) of the civilian police. The civilian police are also assisted by experts (peritos), which are a technical body. The federal police follow a very similar structure to the civilian police, the Federal Highway and Railroad Police. Despite its close resemblance to the military command structure of the Brazilian army, there is no general rank in the military police force because the military police are under military control in case of war, and its colonels report to the general officers of the service branch. The military police also include SWAT units such as BOPE, Batalhão de Operações Policiais Especiais (Battalion of Police Operations) and COE, Comandos e Operações Especiais (commands and special operations) from São Paulo. There is also a riot unit called Batalhão de Choque (Cchock Battalion) and São Paulo Special Police ROTA, Rondas Ostensivas Tobias de Aguiar (Tobias de Aguiar Ostensive Rounds) and Motorcycle Battalion, ROCAM, Ronda Ostensiva Com Apoio de Motocicletas (Ronda supported by motorcycles). São Paulo police also use Helicópteros Águia (Eagle Usually the name of every state's military police officer is Polícia Militar, except for the Rio Grande do Sul police, called Brigada Militar (Military Brigade). The military police have a proenr training programme against drug abuse or Programa Educacional de Resistência às Drogas e à Violência (a training programme to investigate drug resistance and violence) that teaches young people not to use drugs and alcohol. In addition, some police cars are designed to patrol schools, and those cars are painted with Patrulha Escolar (school patrol). There are also Polícia Ambiental (environmental police) or Policia Florestal (forest police), dog units and water police formations such as marine, fluvial and coastal police units under either military or civilian police. There is also the policia punishment, which has been translated into prison police. They acted as prison guards and agents, and they were organized in the same way. There is also Guarda Portuária or port guards working in naval ports and airports. They are a navy and air federal resource that commemorates the Federal Highway and federal railroad police. The municipal guard is often not used mostly in cities and remains a backup force for the military police. They don't have guns and respond to minor criminal activity, and they have titles similar to those of the federal police. Brazil also relies on Polícia Científica or the scientific police. They are responsible for scenarios, evidence, etc. Since they are tasked with carrying out aspects of criminal investigations, they do not carry out investigative work, such as a civilian police officer with similar titles. Military values are exercised by the National Security Forces (Força Nacional de Segurança Pública), which acts as a national gendarmerie force based in Brazil, the federal capital. It is a joint cooperation between the Brazilian state military police under the general control of the National Secretariat for Public Security of the Ministry of Justice. All officers have military uniforms. Policia das Forças Armadas or the armed forces police consist of three units: Polícia do Exército (PE), Army Police Polícia da Aeronáutica (PA), Air Force Police Companhia de Polícia do Batalhão Naval, a naval battalion police company based in Rio de Janeiro These three armed forces officers respond to their own service branches and use military uniforms and troops. Policia Legislativa Federal or Federal Legislative Police corresponds to two parts: Polícia do Senado Federal, Federal Senate Police Officer Polícia da Câmara dos Deputados, House of Representatives Police They have assigned duties to their own chambers and are organised in the same way as the federal police.
