Google hangouts share screen on phone

Chat offers a similar experience to Slack with built-in Google search functionality and integration of Google documents, slides and sheets. Meet similar video chat functionality for classic Hangouts, but with a set of stronger programs. This includes support for video and audio meetings with up to 250 users and integrating google calendar for meeting details and scheduling. Eventually, Google will most likely roll out classic hangouts and move free users to Meet and Chat without the need for G Suite accounts. Until then, the standard Hangouts app is available for everyone. It is also accessible online and has an extension of Google Chrome. How to use the Google Hangouts app perhaps the best and easiest way to use Hangouts is with the app. It's available on Android and iOS, and you don't have to worry about peripherals because your smartphone has a built-in camera and microphone. To get started, you'll need to download the Google Hangouts app. From there, you'll need to sign in to a Google account of your choice. After you add the add-on to your browser, you'll have a new Google Hangouts icon in your browser. Click this icon to open the Hangouts Extension pop-up window.
