

Check your transcripts carefully! The spelling of the date of birth, social security number, name, gender and race must correspond to the transcription. Correct the errors by getting to know Miss Roberson in the control office as soon as possible. Keep in place to remember that students must submit a Florida financial aid application in the past year in high school, before graduation, or they will lose all future eligibility for the Bright Futures Scholarship. Graduation, Bright Futures scholarships and admission to state university all include meeting certain course requirements. If you want to prepare for your career and education goals after high school, be sure to choose the type of diploma and graduation plan that best meet your needs. Standard diploma Standard diploma consists of at least 24 credits completed over a period of 4 years (traditional route). There are two accelerated versions consisting of 18 credits completed over 3 years (parental and instructor approval required). Graduation requirements vary depending on the year the student comes on 9 May. for the class, as follows: High school graduation requirements Although there are rules on the minimum number and type of credits required for standard diplomas, there are also specific requirements for scholarships and college admissions that must be met. The following completion plans will help you prepare for your goals. College Prep If you want to attend college after graduation, you must attend certain courses to meet the admission requirements of state universities. The course requirements for admission to state university are the same for two Bright Futures Scholarship awards: Florida Academic Scholars and Florida Medallion Scholars. So by following the college prep curriculum, you meet the course requirements for high school graduation, admission to state university, and two Bright Futures Scholarship awards. This option is required to go to state university and is recommended (but not required) if you plan to complete an associates in Arts degree in Florida (formerly known as community colleges) and then go to college or college to complete a bachelor's degree. The university prep curriculum consists of at least 18 credits, so it can be completed within the framework of a traditional standard 4-year diploma or accelerated 3-year standard diploma options. Career prep You can focus on a career technical program in high school to gain skills for work or continue after graduation at the University of Florida (formerly under the name community colleges), technical center, or registered apprenticeship program. In accordance with the pre-career curriculum, you will complete your high school graduation and the third Bright Futures Scholarship Award: Gold Seal Vocational Scholars. Scholars. Option is recommended if you plan to continue with a technical certificate/license, associate degree, bachelor's degree, or just want to get special career training. The pre-career curriculum consists of at least 18 credits, so it can be completed within the framework of a traditional standard 4-year diploma or accelerated 3-year standard diploma options. College and Career Prep This combination offers the ability to meet the course requirements for admission to state university and all three Bright Futures Scholarship awards (which gives you a good chance of getting one of them). This option gives you the most flexibility and fits any post-graduation goal. The university and career preparation plan consists of at least 18 credits, so it cannot be completed in less than 4 years. Standard Graduation Prep This option provides you with at least 24 credit course requirements for high school graduation without admission to a state university or Bright Futures Scholarship award requirements. Special degree in Florida, students with disabilities can choose to work toward standard diplomas or special diplomas (Option 1 or Option 2). There are resources to help you learn more about what is required for these diplomas and how choosing your diploma will affect what you can do after graduation (e.g. work, military, career and technical school, community college, university).
