Reigns, Westeros styleFor the uninitiated, Reigns is an award-winning series of games developed by UK studio Nerial. Both the original Reigns and their sequel, Reigns: His Majesty, crown the player as the king or queen of a kingdom full of soldiers, priests, peasants, charlatans, each with their own agendas and desires. Interactions with your ever-larger group of not-so-loyal subjects reproduce as a series of endless binary options in which you swipe left or right on the character card to make a decision. Each election positively or negatively impacts your position with one or more of the four factions: army, church, people, treasure. Increase your position with any of these groups to the maximum or make it get to the bottom and you will quickly be deposed in a fatal and often hilarious way. Reigns has always been a perfect series for short bursts of play on the go. The years of the game pass in minutes and, depending on how diligent you are with your choices, a single reign can last several decades or be violently interrupted in the youthful flower of your noble avatar. Reigns is a perfect game for short bursts of play on the go (online or offline), but it's also fascinating enough to get lost for hours and hours. You can try to survive your record reign or unlock achievements that take each new ruler and, in the case of Reigns: His Majesty, progress through a general story that unfolds on a much larger cosmic scale. Fortunately, while there might have been the temptation to adjust the formula to accommodate the Game of Thrones universe, Reigns: Game of Thrones retains the main gameplay and structure of its predecessors. During a playthrough like Jon, I opted off Varys (yes, sometimes you can kill people with one hit now) and replaced it with a House Greyjoy representative to overturn a military showdown between King's Landing and the Iron Islands.Unfortunately my new Whisper master wasn't so loyal and I finally had to raise sticks and return to Winterfell through another new game addition , travel between locations. Many of these movements are represented by simple background transitions, but others will see you traveling along a segmented path with decisions to make along the way. The night is dark and full of bugsFor all the wits behind Reigns and his adaptation of the Game of Thrones license, some niggles still take away from previous entries in the series. The most enraging are the seemingly random results of some of his choices. Occasionally you swipe left or right thinking you'll be appeasing the church or saving money just to infuriating a priest or ending up homeless. Sudden deaths and fleeting reigns are part of general design, but some of the most vague and cryptic scriptures can occasionally lead to early death that feels unjust.
