A reissue of a now classic American drama. If the law is of such a nature that it requires you to be an agent of injustice to another, then I say, break the law. Then the young Henry wrote David Thoreau in 1849. Three years earlier, Thoreau had put his faith into action and refused to pay taxes because of the US government's involvement in the Mexican war, which Thoreau fully believed to be unfair. For his bold and unprecedented protest, he was thrown in jail. The Night Thoreau Used in Prison is a famous dramatic presentation of this famous act of civil disobedience and its consequences. Its poignant, lively and accessible scenes offer a compelling exploration of Thoreau's philosophy and life. I have a very fractured relationship with Thoreau.
