Buffalo bills wide receivers all time

Jerry Butler, pictured here, was a tight sixth on that list. James Lofton (1989-1992)1 of 54. Elbert Dubenion (1960-1968)2 of 53. Lee Evans (2004-present)3 of 52. Eric Moulds (1996-2005)4 of 51. Andre Reed (1985-1999)5 of 5 The Buffalo Bills are back. They earned a wild-card spot in 2019 with a 10-6 record. In 2020, they will try to take the next step and win the AFC East Division now that Tom Brady is in the NFC with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. Josh Allen took a step forward last season and it had a lot to do with his group of wide receivers. John Brown finished with 1,060 yards and Cole Beasley had 778 yards. They have caught six touchdowns each in 2019. The unit became even stronger when they traded four picks to the Minnesota Vikings to acquire Stefon Diggs. The Bills don't have a real No.1 receiver to go along with Brown and Beasley. Diggs is looking to become the next big receiver in Bills history. And there were many. Here are the top five wide receivers in franchise history.5. Jerry Butler The Bills selected Butler of Clemson with the fifth pick in the 1979 NFL Draft. He played 13 games as a rookie and finished with 834 yards and four touchdowns. Butler saw his career shortened due to injuries, but he was successful during his tenure with the Bills.During his first three years in the league, Butler eclipsed 800 yards and grew his touchdown total by two each year. Butler sustained injuries in 1982. He played 16 games in the next two seasons. Butler missed the 1984 season with a knee injury. In 1985, he rushed for 770 yards. He would call it a career after 11 games in 1986. Butler is currently seventh all-time on the Bills' all-time receiving list. He is also sixth in touchdowns. The Clemson product burst onto the stage as a rookie and was popular with Bills fans. Dubenion was drafted in 1959 and made his NFL debut at the age of 27. He burst onto the stage as a big receiver for the Bills. As a rookie, he finished with 752 yards and seven touchdowns. In the first five years of his career, Dubenion played in every game and started all but two. The 1964 season with Dubenion's best. He was named his only Pro Bowl after finishing the year with 1,139 yards and 10 touchdowns. Dubenion led the NFL with an eye-opening 27.1 yards per reception. Dubenion retired after four games in 1968. Dubenion is currently fourth in yards receiving and touchdowns in Bills history. He was a real big receiver as he leads the Bills all the time with 18 yards per reception. leads.3. EvansThe 2004 NFL Draft had several big names like Sean Taylor, Eli Manning, Philip Rivers and Ben Roethlisberger. The Bills did something in this draft that was unusual for them at the time. That was the design of a wide receiver in the first round. The Bills selected Lee Evans of Wisconsin with the 13th overall pick. He was the fourth receiver behind Larry Fitzgerald, Roy Williams and Reggie Williams.Evans had 16 touchdowns in his first two years at Buffalo. In the third year, Evans became a true Receiver No. He was targeted 137 times and 82 passes for 1,292 yards and eight touchdowns. This was one of two 1,000-yard campaigns for Evans in a Bills uniform. He spent seven years with the Bills before ending his career with the Baltimore Ravens. Unfortunately, it has been recalled negatively in recent times. After catching just four catches for 74 yards for the Ravens, Evans dropped a late pass at Foxborough that would have given the Ravens the lead over the New England Patriots. The drop came in the 2011 AFC Championship Game with 22 seconds left. As a member of the Bills, Evans was nothing short of great. He is currently third all-time with 5,934 yards. He is also third in touchdowns with 43 and fourth in receptions with 377.When the Bills took Evans in the first round in 2004, it was the first time they had a receiver in the first round since 1996. This receiver was a product of Mississippi State. Moulds joined the Bills in 1996 and took some time to get his legs under him. He had only 49 catches and two touchdowns in his first two years. Moulds was first named pro bowler in 1998. He finished with 67 catches for 1,368 yards and nine touchdowns. This began a stretch of eight straight seasons in which Moulds was targeted 100 times or more. In 2000, the Molids would once again eclipse 1,300 yards. The 2002 season was Mould's best of his career. He finished with 100 catches for 1,292 yards and 10 touchdowns. After 10 years in Buffalo, Moulds spent the 2006 season with the Houston Texans and the 2007 season at Tennessee. Moulds is currently the second in franchise history in all major reception statistics. In Buffalo, Moulds had 675 catches for 9,096 yards and 48 touchdowns. Andre ReedThe No.1 spot on this list was pretty obvious. Reed was drafted in the fourth round of the 1985 NFL Draft. You certainly couldn't have expected the production to come from Reed. He quickly morphed into Jim Kelly's favorite target and was apart from a Bills' dynasty that made it to four straight Super Bowls. Reed was named to seven straight Pro Bowls from 1988-1994. He finished with more than 1,000 yards rushing four times for the Bills. Reed had his best season in 1994, He set a career high with 90 catches. He had 1,303 yards and eight touchdowns. Reed issued Years with the Bills before spending 2000 with Washington. He retired after the 2000 season. Reed is one of the longest Bills of all time. He has a stranglehold on all the records he has received within the franchise. He had 941 catches for 13,095 yards. No one comes close to you. Reed has 86 touchdowns in a Bills' uniform, 36 more than Mold's, who is second. He was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 2014 after eight years at the ballot box. Reed is not only the best receiver in Bills history, he is one of the best players ever to wear the uniform. He was drafted 24th overall by the Buffalo Bills in the 1996 NFL Draft. In 2009, Moulds (short for e-money) was one of three recipients named to the Buffalo Bills 50th Anniversary All-Time Team. [1] College career At Mississippi State University Moulds, 117 passes for 2,022 yards (average 17.1 per catch). He ranks fifth in yards and fourth in touchdowns on Mississippi State's career list. In 1993, he had 17 catches for 398 yards and four TDs while being used as a vertical receiver. In 1994, he had 39 catches for 845 yards and seven TDs. He followed with 62 catches for 779 yards and six TDs in 1995. In 1994, Moulds led NCAA Division I-A in Kickoff Returns with an average of 32.8 yds/return. [2] The Professional Career Buffalo Bills Moulds was the Bills' first draft pick in 1996 (24. In his first two seasons, Moulds was stuck on the depth chart behind receivers Andre Reed and Quinn Early. Moulds finally had his breakout season in 1998, where a one-season team record with 1,368 yards, a total that led the AFC and finished second in the league. [3] (Moulds also has the Bills' second-highest single-season season, with 1,326 in 2002.) Moulds' 20.4 yards per catch was second in the NFL in 1998. In its eight Number one for the Bills (1998-2005), Moulds Moulds Receiving 8,523 yards, averaging 78.25 catches and 1,065 yards per season. Moulds' yardage was the seventh-most in the NFL during that time. In 2002, Moulds became the first player in Bills history to record 100 receptions in a single season. In the playoffs, Moulds had an NFL playoff record of 240 yards against the Miami Dolphins, though he lost a fumble on the Bills' first game, a 65-yard pass from Doug Flutie. Buffalo lost 24-17. [5] Moulds established itself as one of the best receivers in football in the late 1990s and early 2000s, collecting 764 career receptions and being selected for three Pro Bowls (1998, 2000, 2002). On April 1, 2006, Mold's was traded to the Houston Texans in exchange for their fifth-round draft pick in the 2006 NFL Draft, which the Bills would eventually use to replace future All-Pro defensive player Kyle Williams. Moulds was released by the Texans after the 2006 season. After his dismissal, Moulds criticized then-Texans quarterback David Carr, saying the quarterback needs to show he can carry [the team]. He was signed on July 1, 2007, and at the start of the season he earned a starting position. Moulds played in all 16 games in 2007, with the fourth-most receptions on his team, second most of wide receivers, with 32 catches for 342 yards. The Titans released Moulds after the 2007 season.
