So a diligent student can learn more than what is rigorous in the course by spending several hours going through the additional materials in the book. The first chapter is a little longer than the others and tries to set the stage for what to follow. I suspect that many students will spend too little time on this chapter. It can be argued that the organization could have been made a little clearer. Chapters 2 through 8 are quite brief, perhaps the exception of chapter 6, which consists quite a bit, including heat and cold, bites and stings, poisonous plants and lightning. Chapters 9 through 11, plus annexes, contain important documents that are not a mandatory part of the course. If you are taking the course, take the time outside the course to reflect on this material. If you do not take the course, you can still learn a lot if you take the time.
