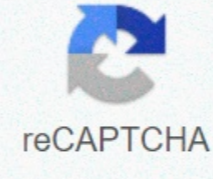

By some estimates, the existence of Italian originated in the 14th century, when Dante Alighieri, the famous poet with Divine Comedy, noted that Italy likely contained more than a thousand proverbs. Meanwhile, Spanish is derived from the Castilian method, which appeared in the 9th century. When the kingdoms of Castile and León combined with aragon in the 15th century, Spain declared Castilian its official language, and Spanish eventually evolved from there. When she utters the last symym (... leucine), Jenny completes the full, technical name of the better protein called titin- a folded, spring-like protein that helps keep our muscles elastic. Total messages: 189,819. English is not always easy - especially when you throw in regional sayings. What does the longest word in English mean? If you, like Jimmy, don't think this bizarre nickname should be considered a real English word, you'll find some support from linguistics. As a scientific and technical term, titin's full name does not appear in any dictionary - not only because it will take 12 full pages to generate 190,000 odd characters, but because of the way protein names are created. According to international guidelines, the technical title of a protein lists all the unique amino acids found inside it. Even the smallest proteins contain no less than 20 amino acids, which produce some fairly long names in their own right: titin, however, is the largest protein of the human body. Total amino acids: 34,350. Spell out each acid name in a row and you get, well, a really long word. (You can see why scientists like titin.) If you think the longest word in English is difficult to pronunciation, start with English words that are difficult to pronounced but not long. So if dictionary editors don't dare to spare their pages on titin's full name, what's the longest word in the dictionary? That depends on the dictionary you consult. Some candidates:The longest word in the 45-letter Oxford English Dictionary: Pneumonoultramicroscopicsilicovolcanoconiosis. According to the OED, this sym meaning for silicosis was in place in the 1930s as a medical term. Yep, the longest word in the dictionary is a joke. The longest famous nonsense word is 34 letters: Supercalifragilisticexpialidocious. Anyone proficient in their Mary Poppins can identify this for themselves, but according to Oxford fanciful appnism means extremely good. The longest non-technical word is published in many 28-letter dictionaries: Antidisestablishmentarianism. (Yep, Jimmy was right about that one—even if Merriam-Webster refused to include it in their pages due to a lack of long-term use). What does it really mean? It used to be a 19th-century political party that opposed the disestablishment of the Church of England, but today it mostly means I know a really long word. It will take you too long to say these words at the dinner table, but uttering other favorite words will make you sound smarter in a shorter period of time. Debate rages between word nerds as to which these are the longest true words in English. When it comes to our ever-evolving language, your opinion is as valid as anyone's.
