Visitor procedures Only important visitors will be admitted to the Scott MS campus and will have to wear face covering at any time while in Scott MS premises. The main visitors will be determined by campus administrators. All visitors will be tested for symptoms of COVID-19 listed above. Any visitor with SOVID-19 symptoms must remain off campus until they meet the re-entry criteria listed in the conclusion of this section. All visitors will be checked to determine if they have had close contact with a person who has been laboratory confirmed with COVID-19. Any visitor who has had close contact must remain off campus until the 14-day incubation period has passed. Employees, Students, or Visitors Confirmed or Suspected with COVID-19 - Exclude and re-enter Any person who is laboratory confirmed to have COVID-19, or who has COVID-19 symptoms should stay at home throughout the infection period, and cannot return to campus until the person's school screens to determine any of the conditions for re-entry to campus are met : In the case of a person diagnosed with COVID-19, the person may return to school when all three of the following criteria are met: at least three days (72 hours) have passed since recovery (fever response without the use of temperature-reducing drugs); the person has an improvement in symptoms (e.g. cough, shortness of breath); and it has been at least ten days since symptoms appeared. In the case of a person who has symptoms that could be COVID-19 and which are not evaluated by a healthcare professional or tested for COVID-19, it is assumed that the person has COVID-19, and the individual cannot return to college until the person has completed the same three-step set of criteria listed above. If the individual has symptoms that may be COVID-19 and wants to return to school before completing the above stay in the home period, the person must either (a) receive a note from a healthcare professional clearing the return person based on an alternative diagnosis, or (b) receive an acute infection test (in a doctor's office, an approved testing site or another place) , which returns negative for COVID-19. Any student who develops COVID-like symptoms during school will be quarantined and will be subject to the same re-entry process. Entry. symptoms may be evaluated and determined by a Denison nurse. Scott Virus Response Protocol Action Protocol: When identifying a possible COVID-19 case on campus, Scott MS will: Immediately separate the individual who shows COVID-19 symptoms while at school until the person can leave campus. Clean the areas used by the individual who shows COVID-19 symptoms as soon as possible. An immediate temperature check of the individual is performed to determine whether it is symptomatic of COVID-19. After learning that a laboratory case has been confirmed at school, Scott MS will notify Denison ISD, which will then notify the local health department, in accordance with applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations, including Americans with Disabilities (ADA) privacy requirements and the Family Education and Privacy Act (FERPA). Closing areas that are heavily used by the person with a laboratory confirmed case (student, teacher, or staff) while non-porous surfaces in these areas can be disinfected, unless it has already been more than 3 days since that person is on campus. Inform all teachers, staff and families of all students at the school if the COVID-19 laboratory case is identified among students, teachers or staff involved in any of the college activities. Denison ISD will purchase an app (Frontline) to track COVID cases and confirmed cases. Virus Mitigation Health and Hygiene Practices Tactics - General Scott MS will have hand-disinfection stations at every entrance on campus and in any classroom. Employees and students will be required to disinfect their hands upon entering and exiting each classroom. Teachers will instruct students on good flushing techniques and other mitigation practices on the first day of enrollment and reinforce these procedures frequently. Students will wash their hands for at least 20 seconds before meals and after using the toilet. Students will be taught to cover coughing and sneezing with tissue. Used fabrics will be thrown into the bin and hands will be washed immediately or hand sanitizing agents will be used. Denison WILL hire additional cleaning staff who will be responsible for more frequent cleaning practices to disinfect high-touch surfaces throughout the day. Cleaning products will be stored safely away from children. Whenever possible, teachers will open windows and doors in the classroom to improve air flow, allowing the outside air to circulate the building. Individual desks will be used instead of tables whenever possible and will be distributed as far away as class size and room size allows. Shared materials will be disinfected between each use when used.

The procedures for distributing and collecting materials in class and work of students will be evaluated in order to limit the as many students as possible. Student movement in classrooms will be limited to discourage the spread of germs. Toilets will be equipped with dividers between facilities and sinks where appropriate social disconnection is not possible. Guests can also make maximum use of the bathrooms. More oversight will be in place outside the toilets. Health and hygiene practice – Face coverings In accordance with the Governor’s Executive Order GA-29, all sms students and employees will wear face coverings unless the student meets with one or more of the established exceptions. The face veil may include school-appropriate fabric masks, getty, face shields or something else that provides cover over the nose and mouth. The area will provide a uniform coating of the yellow jacket, but the student can wear his own suitable for the school. In the event that the student does not have a face covering, the area will provide a one-time mask. Denison’s social dissanding practices will encourage people to practice social distances. Desks will be located to the greatest extent possible to enable social distance. In classrooms where students are regularly located within six feet of each other, teachers will plan for more frequent hand sanitizing. Where possible, physical education and other classes may gather outside to reduce the risk of the virus spreading. Physical education classes will also focus on activities that avoid shared equipment and personal bodily contact between students. Locker procedures will be appropriately socially distracted and monitored during use. Entrance procedures Scott MS students will be able to enter the school building starting at 7:30 a.m. The first bell will be at 8:30 a.m., the instruction will begin at 8:35 a.m., and the dismissal will be at 4 p.m. All students on the bus will use the two entrances to the West End of the campus, all students will use the entrance to the general, and all students who will walk will use the main entrance. Each student will be required to wear face covering and disinfect upon entering the building. Students who choose to have breakfast can buy breakfast for a grab and buy out of the chair, eat in the socially remote café and then move to their first classroom period. Students who do not eat breakfast will immediately disinfect and move to their first class. Scott MS transition procedures will increase the period between classes from 3 minutes to 5 minutes to allow for proper hand washing while resting in the toilet and appropriate wasteful walking in the corridors. The Scott MS halls are wide enough to support 2-band traffic with appropriate social distance and will be marked with reminders of the 6-meter arrows, as well as the direction of the arrow. Some stairs will be and others will be designed for downstream traffic. All toilets will be monitored during the transitions to ensure that the maximum place of employment, as well as proper hand washing, is not exceeded. Students will not be assigned academic lockers to reduce the meeting in the corridors. Instead of lockers, students will be able to carry backpacks for individual deliveries. Lunch treats Scott MS students will be offered several options for lunch and dinner to reduce queue time. The lines will be marked for appropriate social difference. A fourth lunch will be added to the schedule to reduce the number of students in the cafeteria/general things during lunch. Socially distracted places will be located in the canteen and common areas, with dividers where social disconnection is not possible. Students will wear face coverings when they enter the cafeteria, sit and then be released to the table to receive their lunch. While eating, students are not required to wear face coverings, but will be asked to resume wearing them when they are finished eating. Seating and tables will be disinfected before, between and after each exit procedures Scott MS students will be released in a rescheduled format to reduce the number of students in corridors and common areas. Students will be dismissed, along with students on the two buses, which are driven by SMS teachers. These students will be expected to leave campus immediately and use face conceals while off campus. Students will then be released from the car ride and moved to 2 socially distracted detention facilities: 7th grade in the hall, 8th grade in the general. Students will be expected to use the face coverings until they get into their guardian’s car. Guardians will receive signs with the student’s name and class to be displayed in car windows, staff will call students and students will be relieved of work in their cars. From the northern end of Mirik’s main car park, they will remain in the lanes closest to the SMS school building and exit from the southern end of the car park. Seventh-grade cars will enter from the southern end of the parking lot, stay in lanes near Mirick St., and exit at the northern end of the parking lot. Bus riders will be released at a public distance in scott ms and will be released from this place through the western exits with the arrival of buses. All locations will be monitored by Scott MS employees for appropriate social distraction and safety. Denison ISD transportation procedures ask parents to partner with us to reduce the number of students using bus transport. For those using bus transport, students and staff will be obligated to use the when boarding the bus. Bus. MS students using bus transport will be required to wear face cover. Whenever possible, the driver will open the windows of the buses to allow for greater air circulation. Buses will be carefully cleaned after each bus ride. Special attention will be paid to cleaning surfaces with high touch such as seats, steering wheels, buttons and door handles. Denison School District - Scott MS 2020-21 Training models for the 2020-21 school year, Scott MS will provide high-quality education using two instructor training models: In-person learning (traditional classroom experience with safety protocols) Home learning (Virtual Learning Experience) Regardless of the selected training model, according to the Texas Education Code (TEC), Section 25.092, students must attend 90% of the days when a course is offered in order to be credited for the course and/or promoted to the next level. In-person learning This method of delivery is available for students in Prekindergarten through 12th grade. Students will attend school on a regular training schedule and engage face-to-face training in college all day, every day. Classroom learning will be designed to master Texas’ basic knowledge and skills (TEKS) for each content area. Expectations for course work and guidelines for assessing in-person learning and home schooling will be the same. Student participation requires 5 full days per week. Counsellors and school staff will provide social and emotional support. Accommodation and support services will be provided in accordance with the Individual Student Education Plan (IEP), 504 and/or LPAC Plans. All safety measures and protocols referred to in the first section of this document will be used as safety prevention measures to reduce the spread of COVID-19. In the event that a student participating in in-person training must have COVID-19 symptoms, contract with COVID-19 or contact in close contact with a laboratory confirmed case of COVID-19, the student must switch to Home Learning. For re-inclusion in personal training, see the section on turning this document off and re-entering. Training at-home This method of delivery is available for students in Prekindergarten through 12th grade. Parents of students who choose home schooling must attend DISD Home Learning Orientation. Scott MS students who choose home schooling are needed to attend DISD Schoology Orientation. These orientations will be provided in practice. Students will stay at home and participate in learning activities that are transmitted through Schoology. Students/parents will be given a specific day/hour to take physical materials necessary for the online learning (e.g. workbooks, technological tools, etc.) Online training will be designed to harness the most important knowledge of the (TEKS) for each content area. Expectations for course work and guidelines for assessing in-person learning and home schooling will be the same. The training will include teacher-led and independent learning activities. They will be visited daily. Daily participation of students in learning activities will be required. A reliable internet connection will be required for home training. If necessary, denison will give his family space and a computer device. Online Learning Management District Systems has identified Schoology as learning management systems to support the provision of At-home learning for students from 7th to 12th grade. There will be resources available for parents to learn how to support students in navigation skills through these digital tools. In the event that a student participating in in-person training must have COVID-19 symptoms, contract with COVID-19 or contact in close contact with a laboratory confirmed case of COVID-19, the student must switch to Home Learning. Learning model selection process: from July 30, parents will complete an application to inform Denison ISD of their intention to use Home Learning for their students during the first 6 weeks of the school year. Parents are strongly encouraged to complete the application as soon as possible so that the district can determine the staff patterns. If possible, the application must be completed by 5 August. Parents of students who choose home schooling must attend DISD Home Learning Orientation. Scott MS students who choose home schooling are needed to attend DISD Schoology Orientation. These orientations will be provided in practice. There will be a link to At-Home on Denison’s website (www.denisonisd.net). Paper applications will also be available in the office of each Denison university. The district will accept that parents who have not completed the application intend to study in person for their students during the first 6 weeks of the school year. New applications can be submitted every 6 weeks (see calendar listed below) throughout the school year.
