Terminator Rescue (2009) Each reboot of the franchise has one thing in common: one movie that was so bad, it did the studio scrap everything and try again. For the Terminator, this film was ironically called Terminator of Salvation. In the run-up to the release, it seemed like such a good idea. Sucker Punch (2011) It seems that zack Snyder can't manage to stay on this list, checking in with Man of Steel, Watchmen, and now, Sucker Punch is a perfect example of this, boasting some absolutely exciting special effects, but ultimately tragically light on character development. Rotten Tomatoes gave it less than a stellar 23% rating, reporting only \$36 million in box office, which fell short of making back his \$82 million budget. 7. Sebastian Stan the Winter Soldier gets chased through the captaincy tunnel of Captain America and the Black Panther, who seem to have very different intentions for their purpose when they get it-all while the family driving their Audi through the tunnel makes banal wisecracks about the events unfolding around them. It's not entirely consistent with the intensity of the scenes around them, but it once again highlights the difference between Marvel's it's fun to take on superheroes and Warner/DC's keep it his Ethos-Batman and Superman never allow themselves to be interrupted by dad jokes.
