The Arlington COVID-19 Relief Fund: Arlington COVID-19 Relief Fund was set up to support the essential needs of Community members who have suffered financial hardship as a result of the pandemic. So far, the COVID-19 Relief Fund has raised nearly \$160,000, thanks to the outpouring of generosity and community support, and paid over \$100,000 in emergency financial aid to community members in need. Nine months into the pandemic, the economic consequences for households and small businesses remain staggering and relentless. With 40 applications currently being examined and new applications coming in every week, our existing funds will soon be exhausted. Although there seems to be a light at the end of this dark chapter, we are not there yet. Our friends and neighbours still need our support. Arlington Youth Counseling Center (AYCC) Throughout this difficult past year, as the pandemic forced much of the world to close, AYCC clinics and staff opened their arms larger, larger and wider to do everything possible to support Arlington children, teens and families through this crisis. By pivoting our services, we helped ensure continued access to mental health services among young people and families in the city, and we took new steps to ensure that the essential needs of community members were met. Since the pandemic took hold, aycc provided the following additional services: - 5,200 counseling sessions via telehealth - Mental health care for 100 new clients - Sex parenting groups and two community forums - community resource support and case management services to nearly 100 Arlington residents and families in need. - Paid out over \$90,000 in COVID19 relief funding to community members affected by the pandemic These are just some of the many steps AYCC took to ensure our community remained strong and stable during the pandemic.
