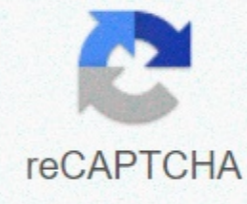

From Beverly Hills to Fresno to Concord (where our California office is located!) and everywhere in between, there are 40 of california's most beautiful high school campuses. 40. Lindsay High School, Lindsay Located in a small town of about 12,000 people, Lindsay High School is a bright lighthouse at the foot of the stunning Sierra Nevada mountains. The school's vibrant green roofs match the equally verdant football field where lindsay cardinals come to life on Friday night. 39. Balboa High School, San Francisco Built in 1934, and known as First in the Pacific, Balboa High is the only school in its district that applies to the San Francisco Designated Landmark. Spain's colonial revival architecture of the school is not only stunning, but it also reflects a period of growth and discovery in California -- an aurm that is still very much alive in Balboa today. 38. Palo Alto High School, Palo Alto Just across the way from Stanford University, Palo Alto High shares the same walls of stucco and terracotta roofs as the adjoi20 faculty. Founded in 1898, Paly is one of the most exhided high school in the area, and its neat exterior still wow passers-by today. 37. Salinas High School, Salinas This impressive Spanish revival school was built in 1921, right in a time of growth and prosperity for the city of Salinas. Although the school was remodeled in 1999, fortunately most of the original architecture, including the great bead, was preserved. 36. San Marcos High School, Santa Barbara At San Marcos High School, located in the shadow of the Santa Ynez mountains and just a few miles from the coast, students enjoy the natural beauty of their surroundings. Given that it's the nickname of the Royals school team, it's no surprise that these Santa Barbara students are going to a course at the palace, which they decorate. 35th American Canyon High School, American Canyon This magnificent 45-acre campus was built in 2010 and contains a 400-seat theater as well as the largest school gym in the district. But the facilities are not only the most modern, but they are also completely eco-friendly. The American Canyon uses green sources such as solar panels, natural lighting and restored water to make the school run. 34. Mercy High School, Burlingame High Mercy students go to school in the house - literally. The foundation was founded in 1931 by the Sisters of Mercy when they turned a 63-room rose-and-rose estate into their school. Today, mercy's students are not only served in the inn - it also serves as a venue for weddings and other events. 33rd Galileo Academy of Science and Technology, San Francisco This 95-year-old school, designed by San Francisco city architect John W. Reid, Jr., is known for its rooftop observatory, open courtyard and neoclassical arches. Recognized after its championship galileo also boasts a newly refurbished area. 32. Fremont High School, Sunnyvale Fremont High was founded in 1923, during what some call the Golden Age of Construction for California schools. Although the bell tower was burned and suffered some damage in 1969, and the school has undergone numerous renovations since then, Fremont's original Spanish missionary, thankfully, remained intact over the years. 31. Mission High School, San Francisco Easily visible with its 127-foot-tall kupo tower, Mission High is the only school of its kind in San Francisco still in its original place. Although the original building was destroyed in the fire, the school was renovated in 1927, borrowing items from the architectural styles of the Mediterranean Revival and the Spanish Baroque. 30. Torrance High School, Torrance You May Recognize Torrance High School as a alma mater of some of your favorite fictional characters, see that it has been used as the location for many television shows, including Beverly Hills, 90210 and \*The Secret Life of the American Teen\*\* \* Established in 1917, Torrance is the oldest high school in its district. 29. Inderkum High School, Sacramento This modern Sacramento high school was built in 2004 and was designed to be energy efficient. Features such as solar roof panels and a geothermal HVAC system ensure that the school remains in service while reducing its carbon footprint. 28. Carondelet High School, Concord Although established with only six classrooms in 1965, Carondelet now includes a water park, a large dining facility, an expansive plaza and many more classrooms than the first six. Elements of the original campus are still uncounted, including a brick facade and marked white columns. 27th George Washington High School, San Francisco This white-column high school is mostly praised for its spectacular view of the Golden Gate Bridge. Built in 1936, the school was completed nearly a decade before the famous overpass, and has seen many changes between its first and 79th grades. 26. Edison High School, Fresno New Edison High campus is only a few years old, but its design is mirrored in the original school building, according to the architects who led the project. Contemporary elements include the use of solar panels and storage shackles, black and yellow interiors that match the colors of the school and the solar screen with a binary code -- a nod to Edison's focus on math and science. 25. Carmel High School, Carmel-by-the-Sea Carmel High School, located between the Pacific Ocean and the Santa Lucia Mountains, is nothing but picturesque. The student body, which is around 900 years old, has facilities including an outdoor pool, a football field with a view and a newly built art centre, which has won awards for architectural design. 24th Beverly Hills High School, Beverly Hills Team Mascot Hills High is Norman, an appropriate choice given the architecture of the French Normandy style school. This wonderful campus has served as a setting for many movies and television shows, including It's a Wonderful Life and Clueless. 23. Wasco Union High School, Wasco Crown Jewel of this San Joaquin Valley High School is its auditorium, the only building in the city of Wasco listed in the National Register of Historic Places. The Renaissance Revival Arts Centre was designed by renowned architect Ernest J. Kump, jr. in 1929. Despite numerous changes on campus since then, the auditorium has remained a fixture at Wasco Union. 22. Tamalpais High School, Mill Valley This Mill Valley high school has a rich history, starting with its founding in 1908. At first, tamalpais was built piece by piece, and partly to the students who helped design the school. At the turn of the century, There was even a bus stop on the Greyhound bus route, where it was named the most beautiful campus in the state of California. 21. Marymount High School, Los Angeles Built in 1923, thisCatholic, all-girls school contains three buildings listed as Los Angeles Historic-Cultural Monuments. The six-and-a-half-acre campus was built in the tradition of Spanish architecture in colonial revival, an astonishing sight to be seen along Sunset Boulevard. 20. Veneer High School, Los Angeles This counrty school in Los Angeles enjoyed its share of screen time, especially as the fictional Rydell High School in the film Grease . His most famous feature is a statue on the front of the school, which was given in 1922 and modelled on the renowned actress Myrna Loy, who at the time was just another student at Venice High School. 19. Ramón C. Cortines School of Visual and Performing Arts (Grand Arts High School), Los Angeles Perhaps the most unique school of appearance in the state of California, Grand Arts is home to seven avant-garde buildings designed by the Austrian architectural firm Coop Himmelb(l)Jau. The campus, located on a 10-acre block in downtown L.A., includes a library in the shape of a cone and a 140-ft tower. 18. Diamond Ranch High School, Pomona This Expressionist Modern High School was designed by Los Angeles architectural firm Morphosis in 2001 and has appeared in several films, including Die Hard 4. Diamond Ranch is located on a hillside. 17. Santa Barbara High School, Santa Barbara One of the oldest high schools in the country, Santa Barbara is located on 40 acres of land in a beautiful region known as the American Riviera. The school's main building, influenced by 18th-century Spanish architecture, was designated a California historical landmark in 2005. 16th Midland School, Los Olivos This Santa Barbara County boarding school rests on more than 2,800 acres pristine ranch land that includes 55 miles of trails and dirt roads and a 10-hectare ecological garden. Chaffey High School, Ontario At 65 acres, chaffey high school campus is one of the largest in the area in the state of California. The school's beautiful clock in a mission that has been out of operation for more than three decades has recently been replaced by a new model, and now every hour is ringing that students are on campus. 14. South Tahoe High School, South Lake Tahoe Renovated and 2013, South Tahoe High School is an open-air campus that encircles brand-new facilities, including a student union, stadium and building for the arts with a 300-seat theatre. 13. The Webb Schools, Claremont This 72-acre campus that rests on a hillside at the foot of the San Gabriel Mountains is the only high school in the world in the nationally accredited paleontological museum. In addition to the museum, Webb also includes a Mediterranean library and a mission-style Spanish brick chapel. 12. Bay School, San Francisco Opened in 2004, The Bay School is located in a re-changing military war room dating back to 1912. With its incredible view of the Golden Gate Bridge and the surrounding bay, it's easy to see how this school got its name. 11. Lakeside High School, Lake Elsinore Located on the edge of a 3,000-acre freshwater lake overlooking the Elsinore Mountains, this Riverside County high school is covered within an amazing landscape. Opened in 2004, the campus covers more than 72 acres and includes a swimming pool and courtyard for students. 10. Flintridge Sacred Heart Academy, La Cañada Flintridge This cluster of mission-style buildings in the foothills of the San Gabriel Mountains was built as a luxury resort in 1927. Four years later it opened as flintridge sacred academy. The bedrooms, though renovated, are the same as the first pupils of the Holy Heart burned, and the dining room in front of the school as the hotel's dining room. 9. Los Gatos High School, Los Gatos Designed by famous California architect W.H. Weeks, this Neoclassical style high school is home to more than 1,700 students in the Silicon Valley area. The campus's skate front lawn is a popular feature of students, staff and alumni, and serves as a gathering place for the entire community. 8. St. Francis High School, La Cañada Flintridge Founded on the site of a former country club in 1946, St. Francis High School is now home to a 12,000 sq ft executive arts center, an all-weather outdoor track and courtyard in the center of the campus. 7. Excelsior School, Pasadena This 17-hectare residential campus is not only filled with high-rises, majestic buildings and green meadows, but it also has a view of the Angeles Crest mountains, which is taken from the breath. 6. Stevenson School, Pebble Beach With its facilities such as a cabin, this Central Coast residential campus feels home for the day and boarding students alike. The Stevenson campus has ropes, a dorm room with lots of common areas and a 30,000-square-square-feet student center. 5. Thacher School, Ojai Going to School in Ojai, California -- A city known for its natural beauty -- Thacher students have the opportunity to explore beyond the paths, horse-drawn and athletic areas that are their campus and in the neighboring Los Padres National Forest. The school, built on the site of a former ranch, consists of a Californian artisan and a Spanish colonial revival of architecture. 4. Idyllwild Arts Academy, Idyllwild This Southern California Art Gymnasium stands at 5,200 ft above sea level, surrounded by pine trees high in the San Jacinto mountains. The isolated setting of the school is counter-weighted with its most modern facilities, including a studio stove, amtheater and movie mounting bay. 3. Santa Catalina School, Monterey founded at its current location in 1950, Santa Catalina School is a hacienda-style sthuist just 1.5 km from the beach. The campus is a mix of both old and new, from the 62-year-old Rose Chapel with its intricate purple windows, to the Tri-Supervisory Mathematical and Science Center, dedicated in January 2016. Squaw Valley Academy, Olympic Valley Located at the foot of the Sierra Nevada, Squaw Valley Academy is the perfect setting for outdoor activities such as skiing, rock climbing and hiking. In fact, the campus is just a few miles from the site of the 1960 Winter Olympics, where students can ski recreationally. 1. Cate School, Carpinteria For a tour of the Santa Barbara Channel or Santa Ynez Mountains, all Cate School students need to do is to find their window room in the home. The colonial-style residence halls at this boarding school have open-air balconies and terraces overlooking the beautiful coastal landscape. Landscape.
