I am hopefully keeping this vague in anyone who has not read this book already. Goodreads Details: Tara Westover was 17 the first time she set foot in a classroom. Born to exist in the mountains of Idaho, she prepared for the end of the world by stockpiling home canned peaches and sleeping with hills bags for her head. In the summer she plastered herbs for her mother, a midwife and healer, and in the winter she saved her father's junkyard. Her father denied hospitals, so Tara never saw a doctor or nurse. Gashes and concussion, even burns from the explosion, were all treated at home with herbalism. The family was so isolated from mainstream society that there was no one to ensure that children got education and there was no one to intervene when one of Tara's older brothers was violent. Then, with the lack of any formal education, Tara began to educate herself. He taught himself enough math and grammar to be admitted to Brigham Youth University, where he studied history, learning for the first time about important world events like the Holocaust and the civil rights movement. Her quest for knowledge changed her, taking her over the oceans and across continents, to Harvard and Cambridge. Only then would he wonder if he had traveled too far, if there was still a way home. Educated is an account of the struggle for self-invention. It's a story of fierce family loyalty and sorrow that comes with the closest break of relationship. With the intense insight that separates all the great writers, Westover is crafted a universal coming-of-age story that gets to the heart of what an education is and what it offers: perspective will have to see a life through new eyes and change it.
