Some manufacturers or wholesalers keep the product outside the PA and ship to PA dealers or wholesalers. The license must be where the product is stored. • What is Other Tobacco Products (TP)? The Cigarette Tax Act was amended in 2016 to include e-cigarettes and their liquid (commonly referred to as svapo), roll-your-own tobacco (loose tobacco that be used for the production of cigarettes), snuff, pipe tobacco and other tobacco products used to chew, ingest or smoke.
