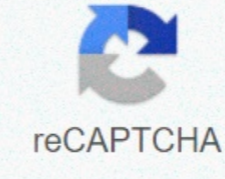

Dear abby ann landers movie

Natalie Portman is close to a deal to direct an untitled film about Esther and Pauline Friedman, identical twin sisters who are better known as the writers behind the Ann Landers union and Dear Abby's advice columns, and the Oscar-winning actress also plans to tackle both roles, multiple sources have said Collider said. Katie Robbins (The Affair) wrote the screenplay, and the film will be produced by Peter Saraf and Dani Melia of Big Beach Films, the company behind independent hits such as Little Miss Sunshine and Safety Not Guaranteed. Born in Iowa in 1918, Eppie (Esther) and Popo (Pauline), as they were known, grew up very close, working together at the Morningside College school newspaper and attending a double wedding ceremony on their 21st birthday. However, once Eppie accepted a position as an Ann Landers consulting columnist at the Chicago Sun-Times, Pauline decided to launch her own column, which she called Dear Abby. This created a rivalry between bitter siblings, and while the two finally reconciled in 1964, their gap continued for decades, until Eppie died in 2002. Eppie and Pauline's contentious relationship was even passed on to their two daughters, who continued the family feud in the future. The husbands and publishers of Eppie and Pauline will serve as the main characters in the film, which has no start date at the moment. Born Esther Pauline and Pauline Esther Friedman in Sioux City, Iowa in 1918, the sisters would have grown incredibly close, dressing identically and even sharing a crib. They married their beauties in a huge double wedding of 700 guests, wearing matching dresses, veils and hairstyles. They even shared their first foray into the world council, co-author of a column for the Morningside College school newspaper under a pen name shared when they were students.
