New haven canal days 2016

1958: Canal Boat was brought to New Haven during Canal Days. 1959 – 1965: Festival activities were not held at this time. 1966: A community-wide centenary celebration was held. This successful event was coordinated by an extraordinary number of volunteers from across the community. 1967 – 1973: Canal Days activities were not carried out in the city. However, the annual Sidewalk Days sale was organized by enthusiastic traders in the city center who banned together and later organized a small street festival along with the sale of the sidewalk. 1974 – 1978 The New Haven Festival Committee was founded in 1974. Festival activities were held in downtown New Haven with strong help and leadership from traders. 1979 – 1985: Festival activities grew and were moved to New Haven Plaza. This is where through Canal Days events took a strong root inside and throughout the community. 1986: Festival activities were moved to Jefferson Township Park... Year of the Big Rainout! 1987 to Present: Festival activities were moved back to the city center after a survey of entrepreneurs was taken. This place has proven to be very successful in terms of participation and community support. Activities were eventually extended to the Schnelker Park area. The festival has been held annually since its opening in 1979 by the Port Colborne Historical & Marine Museum. Port Colborne is located on the northeast shore of Lake Erie, on the southern part of the Niagara Peninsula, and is about a 30-minute drive from the U.S. border in Buffalo, New York. The city is also the south terminal of the Welland Canal, where ocean vessels pass through the city center on their way to the inner Great Lakes or out to sea. Canal Days began in 1979 as part of a larger regional celebration of the 150th anniversary of the end of World Security. This first celebration attracted 400 visitors to the museum grounds where the festival was held and paid tribute to the canal's impact on the community. In 1980, the museum decided to continue the festival and has been growing every year since. During Canal Days, downtown streets and an elevator bridge are closed to traffic, giving way to vendors, buskers, grocers and many attractions. The festival offers a fully supervised children's play area featuring live entertainment, a carnival in the middle, and a live bird of prey and reptile exhibit. Tall ships moored along the canal wall are open for exploration, and special cruises are available on these historic ships as well, including a day-long journey from Lake Ontario, through canal locks. The Lock 8 viewing complex features the Hidden Treasures sales area with local artisans and artists, and the Port Colborne Historical and Maritime Museum offers a glimpse into the city's rich past. West Street, which offers many historic 19th-century buildings, has a lot of buildings. Fans of big band music can enjoy jazz on the lawn at the Roselawn Centre for the Living Arts. Night concerts in the fully licensed Market Square are also a big part of the festival: Classic rock headliners, tributes and local favourites provide something for every musical taste in this great outdoor venue. The festival culminates with a procession of boats along the corridor of the Port Colborne Canal and massive fireworks over the water.
