After the so-called campaign of dirty tricks, British Airways solved the case, awarded £500,000 to Branson, a further £110,000 of his plane, and paid legal fees up to £3 million. Branson distributed his compensation (so-called BA bonus) among his staff. [31] Branson launched Virgin Mobile in 1999, with Virgin Blue Airlines of Australia in 2000. [32] 2001-2007: Enter Space Travel with Virgin Media on 25 September 2004, Branson announced the signing of a deal under which a new space tourism company, Virgin Galactic, will license the technology behind SpatialOne - funded by Microsoft co-founder Paul Allen and designed by aeronautical engineer Burt Rutan - to take passengers into suborbital space. Virgin Galactic plans make flights available to the public with tickets priced at US\$200,000 using the Scaled White Knight compounds. [33] The spacecraft, SpaceShipTwo, is manufactured by the spatial company, which was founded by Branson and Rutan and is now exclusively owned by Virgin Galactic. In 2013, Branson said he planned to take his two children, 31-year-old Holly and Sam 28-years old, into a trip to an outdoor space where they boarded SpaceShipTwo rocket plane in his first public flight, then planned for 2014. On 21 September 2006, Branson pledged to invest the profits of Virgin Atlantic and Virgin Rail in search for environment-friendly investments. The investment is estimated to be worth \$3 billion. [40] [41] On 4 July 2006, Branson sold his virginia mobile company to UK cable TV, broadband, and phone company NTL: Telewest for £900million. A new company was launched with many fans and publications on February 8, 2007, under the name Virgin Media. The decision to join Virgin Media Company and NTL was to integrate both of the companies' parts compatible trading firms. Branson used to own three-quarters of Virgin Mobile, whereas now he gets paid £8.5million per year for use in the Virgin brand name. He owns no part of Virgin Media. [42] In 2006, Branson formed the Virgin Comic and Virgin Animation, an entertainment company focused on creating new stories and characters for a global audience. The company was founded with author Deepak Chopra, filmmaker Shekhar Kapur, and entrepreneur Sharad Devarajan and Gotham Chopra. [43] Branson also launched the Virgin Health Bank on 1 February 2007, offering parents-to-be opportunities to store their baby's navel cords in private blood cells and public banks. In June 2006, a tip-off from Virgin Atlantic led both UK and US competing authorities to investigate price-fixing attempts between Virgin Atlantic and British Airways. In August 2007, British Airways ended £27million on the allegations. The Virgin Atlantic has received immunity from being the tip of authorities and has not received any fines - a controversial Fair Trade Office decision defended as being in public interest. In 2010, Virgin Hotels were launched under the Virgin Group. In February 2018, Branson announced the first Virgin Hotel in the UK would open in Edinburgh. [56] Branson and Tony Fernandes, owners of Asian and Lotus F1 Racing, had a bet for the 2010 F1 season where the losing team boss should work on winner's plane during a charity flight dressed as an intention. Fernandes escaped as the winner of the bet, as Lotus Racing finished tenth in the Championship, while Virgin Racing finished twelfth and last. Branson kept his word after losing the bet, as he served his duties as a commissary on an Asian Air flight between Perth and Kuala Lumpur on 12 May 2013. [57] Branson at the 100 gala in May 2010. [82] In response to the global pandemic, Branson set luxury luxury islands as consequences for a commercial loan to save Virgin Atlantic. [83] Branson said, Over the last five decades I've been in business, this is the hardest time we've ever faced ... From a business perspective, the extensive damage is unprecedented and the length of the disruption remains misunderstanding. [84] Failed business venture Branson has participated in a number of failed business initiatives, such as Virgin Cola, Virgin Car, Virgin Publishing, Virgin Dress and Virgin Rose. [85] [86] However, Branson holds a very optimistic view of failure. He wrote: I suppose the secret to bounced back is not only to be unfeigned in failure but to use them as motivational tools and learning. ... There's nothing wrong with making mistakes as long as you don't do the same things over and over again. [87] World records the attempted capsules from the Atlantic Virgin Balloons Flyer on display at the Imperial War Museum, Duxford, England to 1998 attempted at a flying balloons around-the-world by Branson, Fossett, and Lindstrand finished in the Pacific Ocean on December 25, 1998. Branson made several world record attempts breaking after 1985, when in the Blue Ribbon spirit he tried the fastest in the Atlantic Ocean crossing. His first attempt at Virgin Atlantic Challenger in the lead to the boat capsizing into British waters and a rescue by RAF helicopters, received wide media assurances. Some newspapers called Branson to reimburse the government for the cost of relief, in 1986, in Virgin Atlantic Challenger II, and sail expert Daniel McCarthy, he beat the record by two hours. [88] A year later his hot balloons virgin Flyer crossed the Atlantic. In January 1991, Branson crossed the Pacific from Japan to Arctic Canada, 6,700 miles (10,800 km), at a balloon of 2,600,000 cubic feet of cable (74,000 m3). This broke the file, with a speed of 145 miles per hour (233 km/h). [90] Between 1995 and 1998, Branson, Per Lindstrand, Vladimir Dzhanelov, Larry Newman, and Steve Fossett made attempts to circumsize the globe by balloons. At the end of 1998, they made a highlight flight from Morocco to Hawaii but were unable to complete a world flight before Bertrand Picard and Brian Jones at the Breitling Orbiter 3 in March 1999. In March 2004, Branson set a record by traveling from the Calais Dover to an Aquada Gibs in 1 hour, 40 minutes and 6 seconds, quicker crossed into English Channel in an adequate vehicle. The previous record of six hours was set by two French. [91] Jeremiah in Top Gear Head, Jeremy James May and Richard Hammond, tried to break that record in a more constructed ponial car and, while they successfully crossed the channel, did not break Branson's record. After being intercepted by the Coast Guard and asked what their intentions were, Clarkson noticed "... Our intentions are to go to the Canal faster than 'Beardy' Branson! The Coast Guard wanted them 'Good luck and Good Travel'. In September 2008, Branson and his children made an unsuccessful attempt at an uncommon record crossing in the Atlantic Ocean under sails in the 99-foot (30 m) Virgin Money sloop. The school aims to improve economic growth in South Africa by supporting start-ups with micro-enterprises and skills, advisors, services, networks and finance arrangements. [109] [110] For collecting activities to support the school achieved by the Sunday Times Sunday Fast Track 100, South Africa provides group coaches, at its annual event, where they join Richard Branson on their trip to South Africa to provide coaches and counselors to students aligned participants. in 2009, Jason Luckhurst and Boyd Kershaw of Praise, Martin Ainsworth of the Ainschow Group and Matthew Riley of Daisy Communications helped raise £150,000 in the action.[111] In March 2008, Branson hosted a gathering of the setting of his private island, Necker Island, in the Caribbean with several prominent entrepreneurs, celebrities, and global leaders. Branson Branson at the United Nations Conference on Sustainable Development in 2012 Branson is a psychiatrist of Zero Global Campaign, a non-profit international initiative for the elimination of nuclear weapons worldwide. Since its launch in Paris in December 2008,[116] Global Zero has grown to 300 leaders, former heads of state, national security officials and military commanders, and 400,000 citizens worldwide; developing a step-by-step practice plan to eliminate nuclear weapons; launched an international student campaign with 75 high-school chapters in eight countries; and produce a documented film, Countdown to Zero, in partnership with Lawrence Bender and Participant Media. [117] Since 2010, Branson has served as a Commissioner on the Broadband Commission for Digital Development, a UNITVE initiative that promotes universal access to broadband services. [118] In 2011, Branson served on the Global Commission on Drug Policy and former Latin American political and cultural leaders and other places, in a way to boost efforts to achieve more human and rational drug laws. [119] In December 2013, Branson asked companies to boycott Uganda because of anti-homosexuality bills. Branson stated that it would be against my conscience to support this country... government must realize that people should be able to love whoever they want. [120] In 2014, Branson joined forces with wildlife wildlife foundations and WildAid partners for No Campaign, an initiative to bring public awareness to the problems of wild animal pockets and trafficking. [121] Branson is an opponent of the death penalty, declaring: The death penalty is still cruel, barrel and inhumane. It has no place in the world. [122] The United States is one of the few countries that practice the death penalty, and on 30 September 2015, Branson released a letter of support to American Richard Glossip of the day he was to be executed, buying an ad in the Oklahoma newspaper that had defended the execution.[123] Branson declared the evidence against Glossip was defeat and that everyone is worthy of a fair trial. , adding: Your state is about implementing a guilty man who has not been proven beyond a reasonable doubt. In October 2018, Branson spoke for Jamal A Saudi journalist killed by Saudi authorities in consulted in Istanbul, Turkey has not suspended its advisor role in Saudi Arabia's largest tourism project. He released a statement saying: The extinction of journalist Jamal Khashoggi, if it were to prove [sic] true, would change clearly the ability of any of us in the west to do business with the Saudi government.[124] Climate Change Commitments in 2006, Branson made a high-profile commitment to investing \$3 billion towards addressing global drivers over the course of these decades. [125] [126] However, author and activist Naomi Klein criticized Branson for contributing assets under \$300 million as of 2014, far below the original stated goal. [127] Activist Klein says Virgin Airlines' green gas emissions increased considerably in the years after his promise: Politics [128] Politics of the 1980s, Branson was shortly given the post of Lit Tsar by Margaret Thatcher – charged with keeping British clean. [129] [130] In 2005, he stated that there were only negligible differences between the two main parties on economic matters. [131] He suggested as a candidate for mayor of London before the first 2000 election, with votes indicating he would be a visible candidate, but he did not express interest. [132] [133] [134] In March 2015, Branson said that almost all uses of drugs should be described in the UK, following the example in Portugal. [135] Branson supported continued British membership of the European Union and opposed the referendum in 2016. [136] On 28 June 2016, interviewed for Good Morning England, he said that his company had lost a third of its value as a result of the referendum and a planned enterprise, employing more than 3,000 people, which he announced before the referendum, had remained. He gave his support for a second referendum. [137] Branson endorsed Democratic candidate Hillary Clinton in the run-up to the 2016 US presidential election. [138] Honoured with the Waxwork award of Branson at Mme Tussauds, London in 1992, Branson received the Golden Plate Award at the American Academy of Accomplishments. [139] In 1993, Branson was awarded an Honorary Degree to Doctors of Technology from Loughborough University. [140] In the New Year Honour List dated 30 December 1999, Elizabeth II signed his intention to confer the respect of Bachelor Knight on him for his service to entrepreneurship. [141] It was owned by Charles, Prince of Wales on March 30, 2000 at an investment in Buckingham Palace. [143] Also in 2000, Branson received the Tony Janmus Award for his fulfillment of commercial air transport. In 2000, Branson was listed in the International Air & amp; Space Room in naming of the San Diego Air & amp; Space Museum. [144] Branson appeared at No. 85 on the 2002 list of 100 Greatest Britons on the BBC and voted for by the public. Branson, Aron also ranked in 2007's time magazine list of the 100 most influential people in the world. [145] On 7 December 2007, secretary-general of the United Nations invited to support it for the environment and humanitarian causes. [146] On 24 January 2011, Branson was awarded the German Media Prize (organised by Media Control Tablos), already hands to former Presidents Bill Clinton and Dalai Lama. On 14 November 2011, Branson was awarded ISTAR Prize by the International Space Transport Association of the Hague for his pioneering achievements in the development of suborbital and Virgin Galactic transport systems. [147] On 11 February 2012, Branson was honored with the National Academy of Art Recordings and Presidents' Sciences Merit Award for his contribution to the music industry. [148] On 2 June 2013, Branson received an honorary degree from Doctor Honoris Causa from Kaunas Technology University in Kaunas, Lithuania. [149] On 15 May 2014, Branson received the 2014 Business for peace award, awarded annually by the Business for Peace Foundation in Oslo, Norway. [150] On 21 September 2014, Branson was recognized by the Sunday Times as the most admire business person over the last five decades. [151] On 9 October 2014, Branson was named as no. 1 LGBT ally by the OutStanding organization. [152] On 29 October 2015, Branson was listed by UK-based Rictopia at number 1 in the list of 100 Most Influential British Contractors. [153] In October 2015, Branson received the President's International Crisis Award at the United Nations Development Programme in pursuit of peaceful dine.[154] Controversial taxes are evasive in 1971, Branson was sentenced to one-time prisoners for tax evaluation, having fraudulently obtained export documents for records to be sold on the domestic market to avoid paying Buyer taxes. [161] In 2013, Branson described himself as a tax exile, having saved millions in taxes by ending his main residence and in the British Virgin Islands. [162] This was repeated by Eschequer's chancellor, John McDonnell, in 2016, amid calls for his knighthood to be dismissed. [163] The promotion of SeaWorld Branson was criticized by the Whale and Dolphin Conservation Organisations for profit of selling trips to SeaWorld and similar to the parks that hold dolphins, roles and other sea life in captivity for entertainment purposes. [164] [165] Assault claim in November 2017, singer Antonia Jenae, a singer for Joss Stone, claimed Branson sexually attacked her in Necker Island by placing herself between her colleagues and making boat engine noises. He has a daughter Holly (b. 1981) and a son of Sam (b. 1985) and his second wife, Joan Ellis, whom he met in 1976. They were married in 1989 on Necker Island. She stated in an interview with Piers Morgan that she and Joan also had a daughter named Klare Sarah, who died when she was four days old in 1979. [167] [170] In 2007 Branson was ordained a minister by Universal Life of the Monastery Church to perform an on-flight marriage as part of a marketing effort for domestic flights in USA on America's virgin airlines. [171] From 2013 to 2017 Branson served as President of the Senior Stoic Society at Stowe School. [172] Branson is also an experienced kitesurfer, holding some world records in the sport. He was taken to hospital in Miami for X-ray and analysis. [176] In 2017 Brancier Island homes were left uninhabitable after Hurricane Irma. [177] It was the second time the island was seriously damaged after the building fire caught when it was struck by lightning caused by Cyclone Irene in 2011. [178] Branson's influence stated in a number of interviews that he was greatly influenced by non-fiction books. He most often mentioned Nelson Mandela's autobiography, Long Walk Liberty, which explained that Mandela was one of the most inspiring men I've ever met and I had the respect to call my friend. Investing in his interest in humanitarian and ecological issues, Branson lists also Gore's Best Books list, An inconvenient truth, and the revenge of Gaia by James Locklock among his favorites. According to Branson's book, His Vice, Let's Do It: The Lesson in Life, He is a Jung Chang's Swan and Antony Beevor of Stalingrad. [179] [180] In fiction, Branson admire the character Peter Pan.[181] and in 2006, he founded Virgin Comic LLC, declaring that Virgin Comics will give a whole generation of young, creative thoughts a voice.
