It was the eleventh most played song on Australian radio in 2012 and was certified triple platinum by the Recording Industry Association of Australia (ARIA) [25] in 2013, it peaked at number seven in the Spanish singles chart and exited the charts after two weeks. Despite never charting the German Top 100, the track reached the top position of the German Airplay chart and was gold certified by Bundesverband Musikindustrie (BVMI) [28]. In 2020, the song entered the Scottish singles charts for the first time, with Peak at number 21[30] performing in September 2010.
