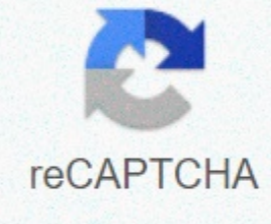




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Clemson University Overview Clemson University was founded in 1880 in Clemson, Sc. The property was donated through the Bequeaque of Thomas Green Clemson and approved by then-Governor John Peter Richardson. It initially became a federally funded agricultural education and research institution that was an all-male, all-white military school. In 1955, however, it became a joint private institution. Today, it is located in Clemson, South Carolina on 1,400 acres in the foothills of the Blue Ridge Mountains near the shores of Hartwell Lake. Clemson University also has a variety of research and economic hubs throughout South Carolina. Featuring 2016, Clemson University serves 18,599 faculties and seeks over 4,807 graduate students with 80 undergraduate and 110 graduate degree programs.
