He stands 6 feet 1 inch (1.85 m) tall and weighs 205 pounds (93 kg). Wilson is known for his large black beard, which he began growing during the 2010 pennant race. Wilson also portrayed Peterson, a pitcher in the film Bottom of the 9th. [1] Wilson pitched collectively at Louisiana State University. His college career ended during his younger era, when he injured his elbow and underwent Tommy John surgery. The San Francisco Giants selected him in the 2003 game. He reached the major leagues in 2006 and had become the regular closer of the Giants by the end of 2007. In 2010, he led the Majors with 48 saves that tied the franchise single season record while posting a 1.81 ERA, and saved clinching games at every level of the playoffs, including the 2010 World Series over the Texas Rangers. In the first week of the 2012 season, Wilson injured his elbow and then underwent Tommy John's second surgery. He completed his recovery mid-season in 2013 and signed with the Los Angeles Dodgers, effectively pitching with the mas a late-inning reliever through the playoffs. However, he was unable to continue his success in 2014, and the Dodgers released him after that season. Wilson's early life was born in Winchester, Massachusetts on March 16, 1982. While he was in second grade, he moved to Londonderry, New Hampshire. [2] Today, he speaks little of his childhood other than to discuss his father, Mike Wilson, who was an Air Force veteran and demanding perfectionist. During the autumn, you would have Brian said in a 2011 interview, I think that's how it should grow. He's not your friend, he's your dad. And he'll be strict. And one day you'll understand why you did these things. But when you become, you become Do you understand why. [3] When Wilson was 12 years old, his father was diagnosed with cancer. His father battled the disease for five years before he died while Wilson attended Londonderry High School Wilson today says he had to be a man when his father was diagnosed. In a 2011 story, ESPN.com author Elizabeth Merrill said of Wilson's high school years, he was an honor role student in Londonderry, but he clashed with various principle elements that did not appreciate his occasional lack of filter. Art Psaledas, assistant principal at the school, added: It happened at perhaps the worst time someone could lose your dad. Seeing his father deteriorate over the years was probably the only thing that made his personality worse. [3] High school career Bob Napolitano, Wilson's coach at Londonderry High School, noted Wilson's ability to focus on baseball. Napolitano specifically remembered the first home game of Wilson's senior year, which occurred shortly after his father's death. No fewer than 29 professional scouts, all with radar weapons, showed up to see him shoot. According to Napolitano, Wilson was completely unaware of their appearance; he ate and drank in the dugout, warmed up, and threw a two-hitter while apparently noticing that the scouts were there. [3] The Cleveland Indians offered him a contract straight out of high school, but he didn't sign, choosing to attend college instead. [4] College career After a coach saw Wilson step well at a tournament in California, he was offered a scholarship to Louisiana State University (LSU), where he played for the LSU Tigers' baseball team, eventually becoming the No. [5] In his time at LSU, Wilson threw in 51 games (22 starts) and collected 18 wins, 10 losses, and five saves. In 2002, he played college summer baseball with the Cape Cod Baseball w John surgery. [5] [7] He also played for Keene's bats in the New England Collegiate Baseball League, a summer league for collegiate prospects. [8] [9] Despite facing extensive rehabilitation, Wilson was drafted by the San Francisco Giants in the 24th round in 2003. He began his career with the Hagerstown Suns of the A-League South Atlantic League in 2004. In 23 games, he had a 2-5 record, 5.34 run average (ERA), 41 strikeouts, and 22 walks in 57 1/3 innings pitched. He made three starts that year, the only time he started games professionally. [10] The Giants changed single-a affiliates the following year and Wilson started for the Green Jackates of Augusta. In 26 games, he had a 5-1 record, a .82 ERA, 30 strikeouts, and seven walks in 33 innings pitched while notching 13 saves, good for second in the league behind Brett Campbell's 19. [11] He also threw for norwich navigators of the Dual-A Eastern League (posting no records, eight saves, one 0.57 ERA, 22 strikeouts, five walks, and 15 2/3 innings pitched in 15 games) and the Fresno Grizzlies of the Triple-A Pacific Coast League (posting 1-1 record, no saves, 3.97 ERA, 13 strikeouts, eight walks, and 11 1/3 innings pitched in nine games). [10] San Francisco Giants 2006 season Wilson started in 2006 with the Grizzlies before getting called up to the majors on April 23 to replace Tyler Walker, who was designated for assignment after struggling to start the season. [13] He made his major league debut that day in relief, pitching two innings, delivering two hits and no runs while hitting out three. [14] [15] He later revealed that he hit himself during his first inning, but continued pitching through the second without informing anyone of his injury. He was optioned to Fresno on June 7 when Tim Worrell was activated from the DL; Giants manager Felipe Aly said Wilson wasn't getting enough game time. [18] Wilson would go on to have three more stints with the Giants in 2006. [19] On July 2, he got his first career save, stranding three inherited runners in the eighth inning and pitching 1 2/3 scoreless innings in a 6-2 victory over the San Diego Padres. [20] In 31 games, he had a 2-3 record, a 5.40 ERA, 23 strikeouts, and 21 walks in 30 innings pitched. In 24 games with Fresno, he had a 1-3 record, a 2.89 ERA, 30 strikeouts, and 14 walks in 28 pitched innings. [21] Wilson's 2007 season competed for the closer role with Armando Benítez in spring 2007 training. After struggling and posted a 7.71 ERA, the Giants optioned him to the minors to start the season. [22] After building a 1-2 record, 2.10 ERA, 37 strikeouts, 24 walks, 11 saves, and 34 1/3 innings thrown in 31 games with Fresno, Wilson was called up on August 11 when Jonathan Sánchez was demoted. [23] He was originally used as an organization man for closer Brad Hennessey, but took over as closer on September 11 when Hennessey lost the role due to inefficiency. [24] [25] [26] Went on to throw in 24 games, scoring 1-2 record, 2.28 ERA, 18 strikeouts, six walks, 23 2/3 innings pitched, and six saves. [21] Wilson's 2008 season remained closer to the Giants in 2008 and retained the role all season. He recorded 24 consecutive saves from May 3 to August 17, the longest streak by a giant since Robb Nen Nen 28 straight in 2000. [27] [28] Wilson was named in the All-Star game after leading the NL in saves with 25 in the first half of the season. [29] He gave up no hits and struck out one in 2/3 innings in a 4-3 loss to the American League. [30] He continued to lead the league in saves until José Valverde passed him in late August. [31] [32] Despite posting a 4.04 ERA through September 6, Wilson converted 37 of 40 save opportunities. In the last seven games of the year, however, he posted a 9.56 ERA while converting just four of seven opportunities. [31] In 63 games, he had a 3-2 record, a 4.62 ERA, 67 strikeouts, and 28 walks in 62 1/3 innings pitched. [21] He converted 41 saves on 47 attempts; his 41 saves were tied with Brad Lidge's total for second in the league behind Valverde's 44. [33] Season 2009 On June 5, 2009, Wilson saved Randy Johnson's 300th victory. Johnson, looking for his 300th win, gave up an unearned run in six innings in Game 1 of a doubleheader against the Washington Nationals; The Giants had a 2-1 lead in the eighth inning. With runners on first and second for the Nationals and two outs, Wilson was called up to get the save. He walked Ryan Zimmerman to load the bases and bring in Adam Dunn. He then loaded the count against Dunn before throwing a so-called three-run strike to end the inning. Wilson then pitched ninth scoreless, keeping the win for Johnson. [34] On September 24, with two outs and two strikes in the ninth inning and the Giants leading the Chicago Cubs by a 2-1 scoreline, Wilson gave up a two-run home run to Jeff Baker. The loss hurt the Giants' chances of reaching the playoffs. [35] [36] In 68 games, Wilson had a 5-6 record, a 2.74 ERA, 83 strikeouts, and 27 walks in 72 1/3 innings pitched. [21] He blew seven saves, but his 38 saves tied for third in the NL with Ryan Franklin's total behind Heath Bell's 42 and Francisco Cordero's 39. [43] He recorded 22 saves in his first 24 chances and was named in the All-Star game in which he pitched a scoreless eighth inning in the contest, a 3-1 victory over the AL.[44][45] On October 3 (the last day of the regular season), the Giants faced the Padres, whom they led by a game in the NL West. Wilson pitched a scoreless inning to earn the save and clinch the division for the Giants. Wilson converted his 48th save that day, tying the Giants' single season in addition to the record of 48 held by Rod Beck. [46] He finished the season with a 3-3 record, a 1.81 ERA, 93 strikeouts, 26 walks, and 74 2/3 innings pitched in 70 games. He converted 48 of 53 save opportunities and led the majors in saves, as well as leading the major leagues in saves from four outs or more (10). With the Giants leading the Colorado Rockies 4-1 entering the bottom of the ninth inning on April 12, he made his second appearance of the season to get storage for the Giants. He walked on a run to make it 4-2, but retired Marco Scutaro with the bases loaded to earn the save. [66] He injured his elbow during the game and underwent Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career on April 19, causing him to miss the rest of the season. [67] During his shortened season injury, Wilson made only 2 appearances with a 9.00 ERA and 1 save. The Giants went on to win their second World Series in three years. [68] However, because he was coming off an injury and would be owed at least \$6.8 million for 2013, he was non-submitted after the season, which made him a free agent for the first time in his career. Since the end of the 2012 season, he ranked third all-time in saves as a giant with any team before the 2013 season because he wanted to be 100% recovered from surgery when he tried his return.
