Roundup product usage chart

By Janet Bayers Updated December 20, 2018 Roundup, a herbicide produced by the scotts company, contains chemical glyphosate as its main active ingredient. How much Roundup concentrate you mix with water depends on the types of marijuana you are trying to kill and the specific Roundup product you are using. For Roundup Weed & Grass Killer Concentrate Plus, mix 3 ounces, or 6 tablespoons, up to 6 ounces, or 12 tablespoons, concentrate with 1 gallon of water. For Roundup Weed & Grass Killer Super Concentrate, use 1 1/2 ounces, or 3 tablespoons, to 2 1/2 ounces, or 5 tablespoons, per 1 gallon of water. Mix 6 ounces, or 12 tablespoons, of roundup extended control weed & grass killer concentratewith 1 gallon of water. Spray existing grinding and spray the soil until it is completely wet. To kill dense brush and invasive vines, mix 6 ounces, or 12 tablespoons, of Roundup Poison Ivy Plus Tough Brush Killer with 1 gallon of water. To kill a fresh stump after a tree or bush has been cut, use any roundup herb and grass killer or Roundup brush killer. Drill holes in the stump and pour the undiluted concentrate into them. By Diana K. Williams Updated on November 28, 2018 Roundup comes in a variety of concentrates. They can be used to replenish empty roundup containers or to comple larger batches in a tank spray. When using a sprayer, choose one made of fiberglass or lined with plastic. The roundup should not be mixed in a galvanized or unlined steel tank; glyphosate is corrosive to these materials. Foam is a common problem when inventing a Roundup solution; Prevent it by measuring the herbicide in the spray and then slowly add water. When properly mixed, Roundup kills everything from soft seedlings to ripe wooded vines. Always follow all instructions and safety precautions on the label. Use Roundup Weed and Grass Killer Concentrate Plus around gravel sidewalks, flower beds and trees. For herbs that are soft, such as annual and herbous seedlings or grasses, mix 3 ounces (6 tablespoons) of this herbicide to 1 gallon of water. For more resistant plants to kill, such as herbs that have gone to the seed, or to prepare a large area for a garden lot, mix 6 ounces (12 tablespoons) of herbicide to 1 gallon of water. Roundup Weed & Grass Killer Super Concentrate can be applied around ornamentals, vegetables and shrubs. Mix 1.5 ounces (3 tablespoons) of herbicide to 1 gallon of water to renovate an entire lawn, or to eradicate herbs and grasses easy to kill. For more difficult jobs, such as vines or perennial weeds, mix 2.5 ounces (5 tablespoons) to 1 gallon of water. Applied at full force, this will kill stumps and bamboo. Follow the label on how to apply it and the appropriate dosage. Roundup Pro works best on perennials that have gone to seeds or are forming buds. To treat them, mix 6.5 ounces (13 tablespoons) to 1 gallon of water. For annual first-sales the seedling stage, add 2/3 ounces (1 1/3 tablespoons) of herbicide to 1 gallon of water. And for hard-to-control, or dense yearbooks, mix a 2-ounce (4 tablespoon) solution of herbicide to 1 gallon of water. Woody vines and dense brush need 13 ounces (26 tablespoons) diluted in 1 gallon of water to kill them; apply to leaves at the end of summer for better results. Roundup Concentrate Poison Ivy Plus Tough Brush Killer eradicates woody vines and brush that can be difficult to kill. Mix 6 ounces (12 tablespoons) to 1 gallon of water in a spray, or refill an empty 24-ounce container of poison ivy ready to use More hard brush, adding 1 ounce (2 tablespoons) of concentrate and fill with water. Never fill a container with a different brand or formula than it originally contained. Follow the label instructions when preparing roundup concentrates for use. Apply the herbicide on clear days when the temperature is above 60 degrees Fahrenheit and no rain is in the forecast. Put on gloves, safety glasses, long pants, long sleeves, shoes and a mask before mixing and applying Roundup products. Avoid excessive spray on desirable vegetation or local waterways. Wash hands, clothes, containers and all surfaces with soap and water. Dispose of empty triple-wash containers in the trash; not reuse. Keep children and animals away from the sprayed areas until the Roundup is completely dry. Dry.
