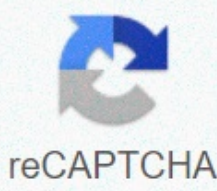




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The desire of ages project

The desire of the Age is not inspired by Robert K. Sanders's The Preface of Desire of Ages, the publisher says it's about Ellen G. White (EGW) in glowing terms: In the following pages the author, a woman with great and deep and long experience in the things of God, has established a new beauty of the life of Jesus. He has brought many new gems from precious coffins. The publisher no doubt referred to the Bible as a precious coffin, where Ellen White discovered her new gem. Ellen was a jewel thief when she stole new gems not from the Bible, but from books in her library of 1200-plus books. Seventh-day Adventists regard desire of ages as one of Ellen White's most Biblical books because it relates to the life of Christ. When the Biblical contradictions of the Desires of the Age were filed, the Adventists sought to defend the EGW not from law and testimony, but from their feelings. They say how blessed they are to read this book. The SDA condemns the Book of Mormon, the Keys of the Scriptures, the Watchtower and others for not being biblical. Yet many of the people who have read these books have felt blessed and have joined the LDS church, Jehovah's Witnesses, and Christian Scientists church. Seventh-day Adventists consider Ellen White's work inspired by God and call it the Spirit of Prophecy. The adventurers claim they hold the highest Bible in their beliefs, yet they deny this by accepting the non-Biblical teachings of EGW as inspired as the Bible. Zaman's desires are typical of the many Biblical Contradictions in Ellen White's books. Desire for The Addition of the Bible Age & Contradiction 1. EGW: Jesus has an older brother All this is not happy his brothers. Being older than Jesus, they felt that He had to be under their dictation. They accused Him of setting Himself above their teachers and the priests and rulers of the people. Often they threaten and try to intimidate Him; But He has appointed His Scriptures as a guidance for the believers. D.A., p. 87. Not the Bible: The Bible does not tell us that Jesus had an older brother or other statements attributed to them as claimed by Ellen G. White. Matt 12:46-47 (NIV): When Jesus was still talking to the crowd, his mother and brothers stood outside, wanting to talk to him. Someone told him, Your mother and brothers are standing outside, wanting to talk to you. How do Protestant Christians view Jesus' brother? Nevertheless, some writings in the early centuries raised questions about the brethren to protect their growing doctrine of virginity the immortal. One of them, often called the Gospel of James, tells mary's life story, using a lot of fantastic material. He claimed that Jesus' brothers were sons of Joseph by a previous marriage. This is a view of the Greek Orthodox Church. Then a famous scholar, Jerome, argued that Jesus' brothers were really his cousins because their mother was Mary Mary Cleophas and Mary's sister the mother of Jesus (see John 19:25). This is the view of the Roman Catholic Church, but Protestant scholars prefer the traditional view of the gospel. Jesus was born of the virgin Mary. Mary and Joseph then had four sons in the way that all men used to do. Holman Bible Dictionary, by W. J. Fallis. 2. EGW: Jesus the brothers sided with the Rabbi his brothers, as joseph's sons were called, sided with the rabbi. They insist that tradition must be uptified, as if it were a requirement of God. They even consider the teachings of man to be higher than the word of God, and they are deeply annoyed at the apparent penetration of Jesus in distinguishing between false and true. Their strict obedience to god's law they condemn as stubborn. D.A., p. 86. No Bible: There is not a single word in Scripture that tells us anything about Jesus' brothers siding with the rabbi, nor have we found brothers condemning Jesus about anything as alleged by Ellen G. White. 3. EGW: Jesus, irritation to his brothers Jesus' example is to them constant irritation. D.A., p. 88. Not the Bible: Where in the Bible do we find that Jesus was a constant irritant to his brethren? 4. EGW: Jesus is accused of cowardice Often He is accused of cowardice for refusing to unite with them (his brothers) in some forbidden act; D.A., p. 89. Not the Bible: Did Jesus' brothers really try to make Jesus commit a forbidden act? Please give me the Bible text. 5. EGW: Jesus brothers remembered Jesus Again and Again He was asked, why are you subject to such use, even from your brethren? D.A., p. 89. No Bible: Where does the Bible tell us that Jesus' brothers once envied Him? 6. EGW: The priests and teachers wanted Mary to control Jesus When the priests and teachers needed Mary's help in controlling Jesus, she was very troubled; Sometimes he waded between Jesus and his brothers, DA, p. 90. They decided and did not make the deed of any good, nor did they give charity. D.A., p. 321. No Bible: Will one supply the Bible text in which priests and teachers want Mary to control Jesus, where Mary waded between Jesus and her brothers and united with the brethren? 7. EGW: Judas chose himself while Jesus was preparing the disciples for their ordination, the one who had not been called urged his presence among them. Is Judas a man who claims to be a follower of Christ. He is now coming forward asking for a place in this student's inner circle. He hopes to experience this through connecting himself with Jesus DA, pp. 293, 717. Not the Bible: The truth of the Bible is that JESUS CHOSE JUDAS. When morning came, he called her to call him to him and chose twelve of them... Judas Iscariot, who became a traitor. Then Jesus answered, Have I not chosen you as twelve? You did not choose me, but I chose you Luke 6:13-16; John 6:70; 3:16PM (NIV). 8. EGW: Judas had the confidence to confess his sin When the Savior's hand was bathing those filthy feet, and wiping them with a towel, Judas' heart delighted through and through with encouragement later and there to confess his sins. D.A., p. 645. No Bible: No Bible record of Judas has the urge to confess his sins in the footwashing. 9. EGW: Judas had no confidence to acknowledge So Christ celebrated this ordinance with His disciples, faith came to the hearts of all the saved Judas. Evangelist p. 275. Note: Does Judas have the confidence to confess his sin, or does he not have this belief? Which EGW statement came from God? Ellen's inspired writings are very difficult to equate because she is often at odds with herself as well as God. 10. EGW: The dog ate Judas' body His weight had damaged the leash with which he had hanged himself into a tree. By the time it fell, her body had been horribly destroyed, and the dog was now devouring it. His body was immediately buried out of sight; D.A., p. 722. Not the Bible:There is no Bible record of the dog that ate Judas. Acts 1:18 (NIV) In return for his crimes, Judas bought a field; there he fell head, his body exploded open and all his intestines spilled out. 11. EGW: Jesus' bones were broken during his crucifixion the Mother of Jesus tortured, almost beyond endurance, and when they stretched Jesus on the cross, and were about to tighten his hands with cruel nails to the fore arms of the wood, the disciples gave birth to the mother of Jesus from the scene, that she may not hear the fall of the nails as they were pushed through His bones and muscles, vol. 1, p. 58. Not the Bible: The Bible tells us, John 19:25, 36 (NIV) These things happen so that the scriptures will be fulfilled: 'None of his bones shall be broken' 12. EGW: Removes broken bone error 40 years later His hand stretches over the cross; hammers and nails are carried, and as the nails are pushed through the tender flesh, ... D.A., p. 744. Note: EGW compiled Desire Age, 40 years after she first wrote that when nails are pushed through her bones and muscles, she changes her account to read: nails are pushed through tender flesh. 13. EGW: Jesus cannot see through the portal the Savior's tomb cannot see through the tomb portal. Hope is not present to Him Who came from the grave of a conqueror, or to tell Him of the Father's acceptance of the sacrifice of the DA, p. 753. Not Jesus told his followers what would happen after his death; He'll be up after three days. Jesus also told Caiaphas, In the future he will Who's telling the truth, Jesus or EGW? The Bible tells us that Jesus could see through the portals of the tomb from the following texts: Luke 24:7 (NIV) 7The Son of Man must be delivered into the hands of sinners, crucified and on the third day taken away again.' John 2:19 (NIV) 19Jesus answered them, Destroy this temple, and I will raise it again in three days. John 10:17 – 18 (NIV) 17 The reason my Father loved me was that I laid down my life — only to take it again. 18 No one took it from me, but I put it of my own free will. I have the authority to put it down and the authority to take it again. This command I received from my Father. Matt 26:64 (NIV) 64 Yes, it's as you say, Jesus replied. But I say to all of you: In the future you will see the Son of Man sitting in the mighty right hand and coming in the clouds of heaven. 14. EGW: Martha and Lazarus' sister, Mary Magdalen — she was led to sin by Simon The Feast At Simons' House. Simon has caused the sins of the woman he now hates. It was Mary who poured over His head the precious oil, and bathed His feet with tears. Mary was first in the tomb after the resurrection. District Attorney, p. 566568. Not the Bible: The Bible never identified Mary, the sister of LAZARUS as Mary Magdalene, nor was it ever suggested from the Bible that Simon led Mary into sin and hated it. The EGW in the District Attorney's Office did not say this mary was Mary Magdalene, but identified Mary as the first in the tomb. The Bible tells us that it was Mary Magdalene who was first in the tomb: Mark 16:9 (NIV) When Jesus rose earlier on the first day of the week, he first appeared to Mary Magdalene, from which he cast out seven demons. 15. EGW: Man is healed on the Sabbath, forgetting it is a Sabbath In his joy the person forgets that it is a Sabbath; And those who fear Allah are not unaware. D.A., p.203. Not the Bible: There is no mention in John 5 that the man forgot that it was a Sabbath or that he did not feel condemnation for obeying Christ. 16. EGW: The disciples fled from the demon-possessed people Their eyes bulging out of their long and tangled hair, the forces of humanity seemed to have been wiped out by the demons that possessed them, and they looked more like beasts than like humans. The disciples and their friends fled from terror; D.A., p. 337. Not the Bible: There is no Biblical record of the disciples who fled these people before Jesus Their. 17. EGW: Lazarus, led the donkey on victory into Jerusalem. The healed fool shouts loudest, heals blind leads the way and the healed defect breaks the branch the most. The blind man he had restored to see led the way. Stupid people whose tongues are reportedly screaming out loud. Those who have been healed with the best of hardness. Palm branch... Lazarus, whose body had seen corruption in the tomb, but who now rejoices in the power of glorious manhood, led the beast on which the Savior rode. D.A., p. 572. Not the Bible: There is no Biblical record of Lazarus or anyone else leading the donkey that Christ rode, or the blind, foolish and deformed man whom Jesus healed participated in the manner described by the EGW. There is no Biblical record of Lazarus even present when Christ rode the donkey. 18. EGW: Small children fell asleep in Jesus' chest Children especially rejoiced. Jesus healed their sick diseases; He has held them in His arms, received their affectionate kisses, and some of them have fallen asleep on His chest as He teaches people. D.A., p. 592. Not the Bible: There is no Biblical record of children kissing Jesus or sleeping on Jesus' breasts. This is just a sample of Ellen G. White's false Biblical teachings in the Wishes of the Age, there are undoubtedly many more. Seventh-day Adventists, who accepted this contradiction of the Bible and addition as being of God, were misled and deceived by their prophet. It is time to make the Bible alone the source of your faith and not the writings of false prophets. Will God ask you, do you accept Ellen White as gospel with her false teachings, or do you accept my Word as truth? The Desire of Ages Library of Congress Myth It is often said by Adventist pastors, that the Library of Congress recommends the Desire of the Age written by Ellen G. White, for other books written about the life of Christ. The conferences had a trip for local churches to contact the managers of major motels in their city to try to get The Desire of Ages in every motel room. We used the Library of Congress statement to promote the book to the motel manager. It was after leaving Adventism that I discovered that it was not the Library of Congress that promoted the Wishes of the Age, but the former SDA Pastor who went to work for the Library of Congress. His name, Wells E. Bement, was born February 7, 1891 and died December 26, 1977. He graduated from Washington Missionary College in 1922 and served briefly in India, was dean and Bible teacher at Atlantic Union College and later worked in education and MV jobs as director. Bement's letter is a personal letter to answer Mr. Nicolas Chaij's question. The letter was not written in the Stationary Library of Congress and is not the opinion of the Library of Congress: December 11, 1946 Mr. Nicolas ChaijApartado 50, General Perazehavana, Cuba Dear Mr. Chaij: I regret that absence and illness have made me not your mail is faster. Now I'm going to do it in a nutshell. To choose five of the six books on the life of Christ from more than 10,000 written in English in the last 300 years, to say nothing of them in another language, and to say that they are The best is no small task. Luckily you have eased the task by asking me to make my personal choice. My preferences or choices will be guided by what I want to get from a book or book to read. Let me put it this way: I will put Ellen G. White's Desire of Ages first for spiritual wisdom and practical application. Second, I will name Dr. Alfred Edersheim's two volumes on the Life of Jesus the Messiah for its relationship to type and ceremonial rituals, and contemporary Hebrew literature. The third will come Samuel J. Andrews' Life of Our Lord Upon the Earth Considered in Historical, Chronological and Geographical Relationships for chronological order, geographical arrangement and authoritative reference. Fourth, I will take Dean Farrar's Life of Christ for scholarship and elegance of expression. We may list as the fifth, 4 — the volume of John Peter Lange's errors, the Life and Times of the Lord Jesus Christ, for voter and complete treatment. Beyond this point there came rushing to my mind so many writers commanded concern that I would be arrogant to try to put them in order. Someone will receive something from everyone, and the subject is complete. To answer your other questions, I would say that Zaman's wishes were well thought out in the Library of Congress. Forgive this late answer to your good letter. Apologetically, It is dishonest for the leaders of the seventh-day Adventist Church to mislead its members into believing that The Desire of the Age was held so high as one of the best books about Christ's life or words to that effect in the Library of Congress and not to tell them that this glowing report was by a former Adventist pastor and that it was his personal opinion. Mr Bement was undoubtedly prejudiced in his selection of The Desire of Ages over other books in the library, becoming a staunch fan of Diehard Ellen G. White. Most Adventists will also choose The Desire of Ages

as their favorite book. The seventh-day Adventist Church was supposed to write to the Library of Congress to get their official opinion. It would be an honest thing to do and then report their findings to church members instead of misleading them. Plagiarism Wishes Days Before Walter Rae wrote The White Lie and The Desire of Ages Project led by Fred Veltman, chairman of pacific union college's Department of Religion, the majority of seventh-day Adventists knew very little or no Ellen White filled her books with material from uninpired authors. Most Adventists believe God is the source of Ellen and little Ellen's book is just a messenger to write everything from her eyesight when she always uses the term, I or I was shown. Few church members realize that what he sees is in the copyright books of other authors. Now Ellen's hand is caught in the books of another author, the church church maintain this practice. How did they do this? This is by comparing Ellen to Bible writers because they often cite other Bible writers or writers who are not inspired without giving them credit. Is this a legitimate way to keep a copy of Ellen? If Ellen gives compliments to the people she copied, there will be no problem. Ellen goes beyond what the Bible writers have claimed. EGW: Although I rely on the Spirit of the Lord in writing down my views as I receive them, the words I use in describing what I have seen are my own, except those spoken to me by angels, which I have always enclisted in quotation marks (Review and Herald, October 8, 1867, quoted in Selected Messages, vol. 1, p. 37). Note: Ellen told us the words she used described what she had seen (the vision) was her own. Yet he deceives us by overcoming His word from other writers and telling us this is His word or god's word. EGW: When writing these valuable books, if I was in doubt, the word I desperately wanted to express the idea was given to me (Selected Message, vol. 3, p. 51, 52). Note: Ellen told us when she was hesitant the word she wanted was given to her. If this is true, he won't copy from other writers. This is positive evidence Ellen White, the Adventist prophet is a liar and a thief. What book did Ellen White use in writing The Desire of Ages? From Adventism's Ministry Magazine, Dr. Fred Veltman, The Desire of Ages Project: what great works did Ellen White use in writing DA texts? We found 10 books from which Ellen White drew 10 or more literary parallels per chapter of Desire of Ages. The Life of Christ, by William Hanna, leads the list with 321 parallel sources. The Biblical Night and Walking and The House of Jesus, both by Daniel March, came in second with 129 parallel sentences. The Desire of Ages Project: data, Part 1, Ministry October 1990, p. 6. Other major sources are: John Harris, The Great Teacher; Fredrick Farrar, The Life of Christ; George Jones, The Life Sciences of the Four Gospels; Alfred Edersheim, The Life and Age of Jesus the Messiah; J. H. Ingraham, Prince of the House of David; Francis Wayland, Salvation by Christ; and John Cumming, Sabbath Night Reading the new covenant; St. John's. Age Desire Project: data, Part 1, Ministry, October 1990, p. 7. What additional sources contribute to the DA text? In addition to the main sources, we found that 21 works written by 20 authors had little impact on 15 chapters. Two authors have worked in the main influence and minor influence categories. Age Desire Project: data, Part 1, Ministry, October 1990, Note: Ellen and her Secretary's aides used 33 books to form The Desire of Ages. Ellen has a library of 1200 plus to copy. All Adventists must be indebted These writers in helping their prophets to succeed in their role as having the Spirit of Prophecy. Seeing these other writers have the first information Ellen used, shouldn't they get the same billing as EGW for having a Spirit of Prophecy as well? See Dr. Fred Veltman's Desire of Ages Project: This is a two-part series. Marian Davis Writing Part of Desire Age A letter by H C Lacey to L E Froom shows that Marian Davis not only used Ellen White's writing she had a free hand in utilizing other sources as well. The letter reads, in this connection, of course you know that Sr. Marian Davis was entrusted with the preparation of The Desire of Ages and that he collected his material from every available source — from Sr. White's printed books, from unissued manuscripts, from personal letters, stenographic reports of his conversations etc—but perhaps you may not know that he (Sr. Davis) was so worried about finding material for the first chapter (and other chapters) And I did what I could for help him; I have good reason to believe that he also appealed to Professor Prescott for similar help, and got it too in a much richer and more abundant measure than I could give. (Letter H C Lacey to L E Froom August 30, 1945) The Desire of Ages Rewriting Many Times In Australia I saw the Wishes of the Times contrived, and I saw the rewrite of chapters, some of them written over and over again. I saw that, and when I talked to Sister Davis about it, I said I should square into this and start finishing things about the spirit of prophecy. If this false position had never been taken, it would have been much clearer than it is now. What is accused of plagiarism will all be simplified, and I believe people will be saved for the cause if from the beginning we have understood this as it should be. With false views held, we face difficulties in straightening out. We will not face those difficulties by using false claims. E. G. Daniells, Bible Conference 1919, Spectrum, May 1979, p. 51.
