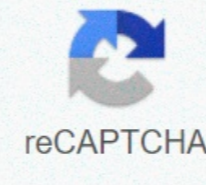

Menlo Park Academy Alternative High School provides students with a safe learning and supportive environment where students are treated with respect and seen as individuals with their own particular learning styles and social needs. Menlo Park Academy is an alternative contract high school provided through Minneapolis Public Schools, serving up to 75 students. Our program is for students from 10th to 12th grade until the age of 21 looking for a high school diploma. Ninth graders are considered after their first semester in high school. Access for ELL students: February 25 to March 1MCA Reading (10th grade); March 11- March 15, April 15-18MCA Mathematics (11th grade); April 15- May 3 MCA Science: April 29 - May 10ACT (11th grade Students); April 24MAP Reading/Winter Mathematics (not tested 9th & 10th grade); January 10-18thMAP Reading/Mathematics Spring (all students 9th and 10th grade); 6-May 24-Recordings/credit information is mailed every 3 weeks during the school year. We offer a full range of subjects needed for graduation, each with a focus on high-interest learning and real life. Classes are designed to meet the needs of many types of students, including visual, linguistic, kinesthetic, auditory, and interpersonal students. Courses range from basic skills to college readiness work, and class size ranges from eight to twenty students. Students can form credits through independent study projects and out-of-school employment. In addition, credit earning internships are available to connect students with future careers and their community. Staff provide assistance to seniors and their families as they go through the steps to move to employment, college, or technical programs. This assistance includes financial aid resources, application assistance, college visits, and career guidance. Staff encourage students to stay in touch after graduation and use former teachers as resource as they move into the world. Our Counseling Program provides each student with additional support by tracking class credits, maintaining contact with parents, and helping students with academic goals. Counselors also train students as they develop problem-solving skills on topics ranging from school, jobs, and family. They serve as links for students with other staff in case of conflict and advocate for the needs of students. Counseling services are available with part-time mental health therapists. Families receive a mail-order update on their students' progress every three weeks. Parents/guardians are always welcome to ask for more frequent updates or to schedule a meeting with counselors or other staff. Bus tokens are provided for students living more than two miles from the school. Bus route 11 stops in front of the school building. Our school day lasts from 8:50 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. School breakfast and lunch programs are available. Childcare is available for students with children. East Side Neighborhood Services operates Northeast Child Development Center for infants through pre-kindergarteners. Call (612) 787-4048 or check our website for more information. Placement can be immediate or take up to two quarters, depending on space and demand. North Star has placed Menlo Park Academy in a group of schools aimed at improving because our 4-year graduation rate is below state goals for all student groups. While graduating in 4 years is not a realistic goal for many of our students arriving as young people and seniors 1-2 years late in credit, our goal as a school is to look at all the actions we can take to move students to a diploma as quickly as possible. These include independent and additional credit opportunities, elective credit for employment, and winter vacation and spring break learning options.
