Zone 1 doesn't work at all. It's getting very warm in South Central Texas this time of year. When I check the thermostat both set points are set by 73 degrees F. Checking the internal temp readings zone 1 indicates 32 degrees F when it's actually about 94 degrees F (I said a typical day in South Central Texas). I think the thermostat trusts the internal temperature above 74 degrees. I tried a few things but can not get zone 1 A \C unit to work consistently. When the washing machine goes into a spin cycle it could be shaking the heater just enough to make contact and then it will start reading properly for a short time. If it's still under warranty, you might want the trader to look at it. From what you've said about doing when your wife runs a washing machine, I'd like to try to look for a front sensor on one of the walls around the washer/dryer and see if there's a wire that's loose and making contact when shaking the washer.
