Historians estimate that by the end of the decade, three-quarters of the American population visits cinema every week. The ban took place between 1920 and 1933. These are: #Fairness balance As a reporter you have to learn to get a different point of view. This could mean calling a person late at night to get his side of the story and even holding back the story of investigators for a day. But you have to do it. This is the best way to bring balance to your copy. There may be times when a person can avoid making statements. In this case, the point shall be indicated, indicating the efforts made to obtain its point of view. Honesty requires you not to assign motives. Keep in mind that your news report will be read by hundreds of people and you can influence their thinking with loaded words. It is always best to use neutral words. # Accuracy This is the first requirement for a good news report. You must obtain all your facts right, ranging from the name and designation of the item to the statements made by him. You can't hide behind the excuse that there wasn't enough time to go check the facts. The facts you need to check are: Names and their spelling Markings Incident details. In the event of an accident, you should know the exact number of people who have been injured or killed. Statements: The citation reported in the information report must be accurate and contextual. It should not be misinterpreted to suggest a different meaning. If this is a learning history, make sure that all names are correctly spoughed, and explained. If this is a sporting story, you need to make sure that the number of runs made or goals scored is accurately listed. If the is a court history that must be ensured that the court's verdict is presented accurately. # Attribution All press reports, with a few exceptions, must be obtained. The source can be identified as follows: a. 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Exceptions: A reporter doesn't have to worry about assigning in these cases that he or she witnessed. For example, a reporter can report a cricket match or rally stating what happened. This is because these are factual statements that have taken place in the public domain and have been witnessed by many people. The same applies to the swearing-in of a new government or historical facts. # Brevity The meaning of this trait cannot be overloaded. You have to learn to write stories without losing important facts. Please note that today's reader is in a hurry. There is no patience to go through long press reports. Brevity doesn't mean writing stories. This also means using short words, short sentences, and short paragraphs. # Brightness It is not easy to achieve. You must report the event in the smallest possible axis. You can do this if you use short and simple words and stick to irrelevant facts. The report intro must be short and clear. The body must be composed of as few paragraphs as possible, each paragraph being dedicated to one point. There should be no ambiguities.
