Rent costumes you don't have and make a deal with a costume store that you will use exclusively if you give it a discount. Put flyers on its counter and ask to place an ad on its website. Offer customers a small discount, maybe 10%, for using brochures (they can read you the code over the phone), so you can track how customers hear about you and know the best places to advertise.
