

campus housing:[171] Alvarez Hall (Alvarez): A four-story residential hall and the second newest residential complex on campus, opened in the fall of 2013, with 618 students. The hotel is next to Chaparral Village, Rec Fields and Convocation Center. Students are organized into special interest communities including Engineering, Honors,

complex on campus, opened in 1986; a four-story dormitory for about 500 student residents. It offers rooms in configurations for 1 and 2 people, with an activity center, study lounges and a shared kitchen. [174] Hall: The $43.6 million four-story residential hall is designed for incoming honorary students. In addition to dormitories, a shared
kitchen and laundry facilities, the building also offers multipurpose rooms for study groups and collaborative learning. It is set to be ready for the 2021 fall semester. [175] Laurel Village, Laurel residents are also able
to use chap pool, hot tub, and outdoor picnic areas. [176] Two neighborhood centers provide residents with 1, 2 and 4-room
configurations; second oldest residential complex on campus. Amenities include paid tools, high-speed Internet access and cable. Rowdy Houses provides residents with activity centers, 24-hour laundry and pool access. University Oaks houses about 1,400 students in total. Greek life About 4% of both lower men and women are

issued Come and take it flag. [214] On home soil, Rowdy runs out to the middle of the field and waving the UTSA flag Come And Take It signaling that everyone is rallying behind the team. The student section is then draped over by a large Come and take it flag. [115] The UTSA class ring serves as a symbol of pride and achievement.
The night before ring ceremonies, the UTSA rings are placed in the Alamo overnight. [100] This tradition, unique to UTSA, began in 2012 as part of the university's efforts to build on long-standing traditions. [217] [100] Best party and Fiesta UTSA Fiesta UTSA, an annual event held in April, began in 1978. music, a jalapeño
eating competition, a watermelon seed spit competition, a dunk tank, and other activities. [220] Fiesta UTSA has dozens of stalls are run by registered student organizations and offer food, drinks and games. The Campus Activities Board sponsors bands and other musicians
throughout the day. Fiesta UTSA became the kickoff event for fiesta San Antonio every spring, having been added to the official beginning of the Fiesta. Best Fest, an annual celebration held in October, began in 1978 (as
Bestfest) as a special greeting to five of the state's outstanding festivals, including New Braunfels's Wurstfest, Corpus Christi's Buccaneer Days, San Antonio's Fiesta, the Texas State Fair in Dallas, and George Washington's birthday celebration in Laredo. [100] It was presented by the student organization Variety 79. [122] In 1979, the
event was said to be a greeting to five of the city's outstanding festivals: Fiesta Navidena, King William Fair, La Feria del Rio, The San Antonio Stock Show and Rodeo, and the Texas Folklife Festival. In the late 1970s, Best Fest included performances by the UTSA Brass Ensemble and UTSA Jazz Ensemble, several competitions such as
the jalapeño eating contest, egg throw, Walking the Plank Contest, Pee Wee Bicycle Races and others. The modern Best Fest incorporates a Halloween theme with costume and exhibition decoration contests. Homecoming has many traditions at UTSA. One of the most remarkable, the annual Golf Cart Parade, is a unique
event for UTSA. [100] Student organizations team up to design and create decorated golf carts according to this year's homecoming theme, showing them off in front of an audience of over 9,000 Roadrunner fans. [223] [224] [225] Each submission is constructed by students at the Golf Cart Decorating Party, an event held just a few days
before in the University Center. [100] The parade has been an official part of the university's homecoming ceremonies since 1993. In 2004 it was combined in the Rowdy Rampage Fireworks Spectacular, along with spirit rally and a concert of live music. [100] University Life Awards The University Life Awards (also known as ULAs) is an
award ceremony sponsored by the Student Government Association with the aim of recognizing outstanding leadership on campus. [100] It recognizes students, student organizations, faculty and staff who have made an exceptional difference in the UTSA community. [100] It is touted as the university's oldest tradition. [100] Individuals
and organizations are nominated by fellow students, faculty or employees. Prices include most outstanding student (of colleges and classification), Greek male and female of the year, Jane Findling and the Golden Feather Award. and is currently a member of Conference USA. Roadrunners compete in 17 intercollegiate sports, including baseball, men's and women's end women's end women's and women's and women's end w
university has hosted 17 NCAA Division I Championships since 1997, including four men's Final Fours, two women's Final Fours and a pair of women's Final Fours and a pair of women's volleyball championships. [233] [234] [235] UTSA has taken more than 70 conference championships and has played more than 50 playoff games in the NCAA. [236] [137] The home of
utsa basketball and volleyball teams is the Convocation Center, a multipurpose arena with more than 4,000 seats on the UTSA Main Campus. The Park West Athletics Complex opened in 2013 as the home of the football, field and field programs. Baseball, softball and tennis teams all play on campus facilities. UTSA's main rival is the
Texas State University Bobcats. The two universities play each other in a series known as I-35 Rivalry. [238] Both schools have been conference and then in the Western Athletic Conference (WAC). UTSA and Texas State are now in different conferences, with UTSA in Conference USA
(C-USA) and Texas State in the Sun Belt Conference. The management of both universities have stated their interest in preserving football rivalry, even though the institutions are in various conferences. Utsa is one of four schools in Texas in the C-USA, along with North Texas Mean Green, Rice Owls and UTEP Miners. In 2019, after
working closely with Brenda Tracy, the founder of the national campaign and non-profit SetTheExpectation, [240] UTSA became the first university in the country to implement the Tracey rule that is the most comprehensive Serious Misconduct rule in the NCAA. [241] [242] [243] The rule ensures that a current or prospective student athlete
who has been convicted of, pleaded guilty or no contest to a felony or misdemeanor involving serious misconduct, has been found a felon in relation to a juvenile code equivalent, or has been disciplined by the university or athletic department at any time during enrollment at any collegiate institution (except temporary disciplinary action
during an investigation) due to serious misconduct shall not be eligible for athletic financial assistance, practice or competition at The University's inception. In a 1971 article titled UTSA does not want football, President Arleigh Templeton rejected
the idea that the university should acquire a football team, saying When we start playing football, we will play the best competition available. [100] A referendum in 2007 doubled the university's athletics fee, effectively paving the way for the program's arrival in the fall of 2011. The university won its first football game against Northeastern
State University on September 3, 2011 at its home ground, the Alamodome. With 56,743 spectators, UTSA set the NCAA record for the highest-hit first game for a startup program. [21] Roadrunners also broke the attendance record for a first season, averaging 35,521 per game. [21] UTSA led the WAC in attendance for the 2012 season.
[146] Roadrunners now compete in Conference USA, along with former WAC member Louisiana Tech. [247] The UTSA administration now supported the move, and then-President Ricardo Romo added that the conference will suit roadrunners well. [22] Controversy In 2011, the Center for College Affordability and Productivity ranked
UTSA's freshman as the second most unhappy in the country, based solely on low retention rates. [148] Deputy Vice President David Gabler rejected this claim, telling 1200 WOAI that the investigation is completely false. [100] Members of the Student Government Association responded by sponsoring a resolution that rebuked the
allegations, pointing out that the Coordinated Admissions Program distorts freshmen retention rates. [250] As of 2011, about 30% of CAP students did not return to university for their second year. In November 2018, a video emerged online of a black student being escorted out of an A& amp; P-lecture by uniformed officers. The
student had allegedly rested her feet on the chair in front of her, and when the professor asked her to sit properly, she allegedly refused. The student denied disobeying the code of conduct. [100] The university immediately conducted an investigation into the incident. The professor was
immediately relieved of his duties as an educational instructor and a replacement instructor was appointed to teach the rest of the fall 2018 semester. The investigation found that the incident was far more complex than the viral video could depict. The professor will be allowed to return to teaching in the spring of 2019, on the condition that
she undergo relevant training and commits to follow-up meetings for a period of three years.
