Just to be clear, these numbers are not fake numbers — they work the same way as your regular number and receive both voice calls and text messages. The difference is that each disposable burner number ends after seven days, or 20 minutes of conversation, whichever is the first. Phone numbers are part of an old network that is getting dumber, in relative terms, day by day, said Greg Cohn, founder and CEO of AdHoc Labs, which created Burner, in a statement. You give out your number and it's all or nothing; it's there forever. And in the age of Facebook and social media, we know that the phone can be much smarter. The burner is the first part of this vision.
