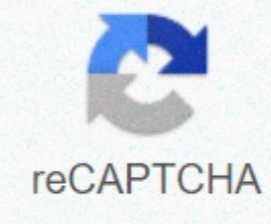

Oxford Companion to Beer's definition of bottle sizes for beer are standardized in most countries around the world, but this has not always been the case. Early beer bottles in the UK often came in sizes known as purged pints, equivalent to one-twelfth imperial gallon, 13 Imperial liquid ounces, 378ml, or an alleged litre, 26 fl oz. The reputed pint is close in size to the regular modern bottle size of beer in the U.S., a standard longneck 355 ml (12 US fl oz). The alleged pint and alleged letter was made in the UK in the early 20th century. However, stronger beer and barley wines were often sold in bottles holding one-third of a pint, 6.66 fl oz, known as nipples. In the United States, standard bottle sizes ranged between 325 and 385 ml (11 and 13 US fl oz) before settling at 355 ml. Other bottle sizes of beer included split, 6 US fl oz, for stronger beers. Larger bottles are usually 650 ml (22 US fl oz). It has become a popular size for American craft-brewed beer, as well as a Champagne-style 750-ml bottle, often with cork and wire water. At the other end of the quality spectrum is the infamous 40-ounce bottle, which in itself has almost become synonymous with cheap, ugly malt liqueurs, strong adjective-driven beers peddled by mass market breweries. In Canada, the standard bottle size is 341 ml (12 Imperial fl oz). After the mandatory use of metric units in the UK came into force in 1995, many British brewers used 550ml bottles, although most have now turned into a standard 500ml bottle. Bottles of smaller size in the UK are usually 275 ml or, more often, 330 ml. In Europe, a standardised 330 ml EU bottle is common, although there is often a 300 ml bottle in the Netherlands. Larger bottles are generally 750ml, and these are particularly popular in Australia's Belgium. In Northern Territory Darwin stubby is a 2-l bottle of beer, originally four Imperial pints (2.27 l), sold to earn the region's reputation for beer consumption. Two-pint bottles, with ceramic swing tops, are also found in Germany. Magnums (1.5 l) and larger sizes are occasionally seen, although these tend to be collectibles or display cases, usually stuffed handmade in a brewery. See also bottles. NipHli kohol bottle size known as nipple is also called mini and contains 50 ml of alcohol. That's about 1.7 ounces and about one 1.5-ounce shot. A quarter pint quarter pint of alcohol bottle size is 100ml and contains 3.4 ounces. It's not exactly a quarter of a litre, but it's still known as a quarter of a litre.
