Back to Ori and the Walkthrough of the Blind Forest Enter Mount Horu. Take a look at the map. The place you need to get is really under lava at the moment. You will need to block several rivers of lava before continuing until the last part of the game. There is a Spiritual Well under the lava to the right and the exit of Mount Horu is to the left. To remove lava from this area, you will need to enter a series of caves and prevent the lava from flowing. Make your way to the top of Mount Horu and enter the caves to both the upper right corner and the upper left corner. Each time you enter a cave you will have to go to a stone or some other device to prevent the lava from flowing inside each of the caves. Return and enter the next lower caves and continue back to the base of Mount Horu. Once you have stopped all the lava flowing the areas to the left and right from where you first entered this section will be free of lava. Go down to the left and enter the last cave where you will find the Element of Heat. Mount Horu Escape Make your way right quickly by jumping over the lava and avoiding debris falls. This escape is not very difficult, but you may need to try a few times to find out where you need to go. Once you have escaped from Mount Horu you can enjoy the final cutting scene. When a stone fragment of the map is placed on a map stone, a large part of the map is revealed. Stone fragments from the map are scattered throughout Nibel and usually require some extra effort to collect. The game ignores where a stone fragment came from the map, so that part of the map is revealed is determined only by the map stone itself. For example, bringing a stone fragment from the Map of the Sunken Glades and using it in the Abandoned Ruins will still reveal all the Abandoned Ruins. Mount Horu is a mountain that serves as the ultimate challenge that Ori must overcome on his journey. Housing the Element of within its core, Mount Horu slowly builds toward an eruption throughout the game and almost results in Nibel's complete destruction. Mount Horu is inaccessible until Ori obtains the Sunstone at the top of the Sorrow Pass. In the original Ori and the Blind Forest, it was also a point of no return: once Ori entered, they could not go out and continue to explore the rest of the forest. This has been changed in the Final Edition, allowing players to leave Horu at any time. A lava fall in the inner chambers of Mount Horu is invaded by lava, the ferocity of the volcano unable to be controlled after the Heat Element lost its power. Large sections of the mountain are cut by chains of molten rock, which are fatal in case Ori touches them. To progress, Ori must climb to the height of Mount Horu and work his way down, solving the puzzles of each chamber in order to restrict lava flow and open up new areas. All player skills are required to prevail. Ori and the Blind Forest/Definitive Edition[edit | editing source] Attention! Spoilers ahead. After finally entering the core of Horus, Ori and Sein discover the Element of Heat and finally rekindle it. However, before they can celebrate their victory, Kuro arrives and tries to hunt them down. As horu fires begin to leak into the surrounding desert, Ori flees kuro's rapid pursuit and dives into the burning trees. Sein notices the Spiritual Tree not far from its location and begs Ori to stand up so they can complete their task. While the two are about to use the Kuro Feather to reach the Tree and reunite Sein with his former home, Kuro takes advantage of both of the sky and severely injures Ori with his claws. Thorns on Mount Horu Naru, having been revived thanks to Gumo's kindness, eventually finds an unconscious Ori and cradles him. Kuro observes, realizing that by wounding Ori she became the monster she saw the Spiritual Tree as to kill her own children. She decides to make things right and takes Sein back to the Spiritual Tree. As the ancient being gains back its power, Kuro gets lost in the light and a calming flood of rain calms the fire from the destruction of Horus, saving the forest. Trivia[edit | edit source] In the original version of Ori and the Blind Forest, completing Mount Horu would block this particular rescue file, meaning that any secrets or exploration not yet completed had to be done before taking over the mountain. In the Final Edition, this has been fixed to allow players to recharge their savings shortly before entering Horu after it has been released. The phrase, Ori, if we go into this place, we may never come back... was changed in the Definitive Edition to read: Let's be careful, many of that in this place never came back.
