Review the terms of the housing license agreement When you apply for the home, you are signing a legally binding contract with Wayne State University. It is important that you review all the information, dates, deadlines, and policies described in the license agreement that you sign. Under 18s Students: If a student signs the conditions of the housing license agreement in the application of the home, while still under 18 years of age, the parent/guardian listed of the student must also review, accept and sign the license agreement. A housing application has not been completed until the student's parent/guardian completes part. Review the different housing options There is a variety of different types of housing that a student can choose from based on their standing class, age and housing needs. 4. Review fees It is important that a student reviews the different rates related to each location of the home and the type of room. There are a variety of cost options for students to choose from. Expenses are listed for the academic year (August-May) and per semester. All housing and dining costs are billed per semester. 5. Reviewing the options of the living learning community Learning Communities provide students with a unique opportunity to connect with academic staff, both in the classroom and with housing community. Some communities are restricted to students within specific schools. 6. Reviewing meal plan options based on a student's class standing and the location of the home they select to live in may require different meal plans. There are a variety of options to meet students' dining needs. 7. Continue with the Self-Service Housing Portal in order to complete Housing application, a payment of the \$125 non-refundable application fee is required. Once the payment has been made, the student will receive a confirmation of receipt by email to their Wayne State email account. If you have requested the autumn semester and cancelled your application, DO NOT FILL IN THE PAYMENT. Please stop making payments and housing@wayne.edu requesting that your application be reset for the winter semester of 2021. 8. Receive the room assignment After completing the home application and fee payment, you will receive an email to your Wayne State email account with your room allocation. The tasks for the winter semester 2021 will be carried out by housing staff from the end of November 2020. Transcription Choosing a room for you and/or your group of roommates is the final step in the self-selection process. To start from the home page of the self-service portal of the house, you will see the type and time of selection of your room selection group (if applicable) and the date and time of selection of the room under the heading Room Selection. This indicates as soon as possible that you can select a room, but you can do so at any time after the start time until the end date of the selection. You can then click the blue button or go to the top menu and click Select Roommate. Then click Select a room or suite. On the next page, you'll see everyone in your group of roommates (if any) including yourself. Make sure the check box next to its name is selected to make sure all of them are placed together in the same room or suite. You'll see filters for room type, building, or communities of special interest. You can use them to reduce your preferences as you search for a room/suite. We recommend that you only use one type of filter at a time to make sure you find a room that meets your search criteria. When filters are selected, click the Find Available Rooms button. This will take you to a page with all the rooms available on the search criteria that you or your group of roommates are eligible to select from. Review the different types and the half-yearly rates listed next to each available room or suite. Each person is responsible for paying the semester room price for their room/suite allowance. We wanted a D suite in Towers and we think Room 210 is a good choice. So we'll click on the select suite. Then the following page will allow you to choose which bed each individual in your group is assigned to. Please discuss bed tasks with your group ahead of time to make sure everyone is happy with the selection. If everything looks good, well, a I agree - Send my room selection. You will then be taken to a confirmation page that lets you know that your selection is confirmed. In addition, if you go to the home page of the self-service portal of the house, in The selection of the room you will see the room information and your roommates. Housing & Residential Life is accepting volunteers for Warrior Welcome Crew 2020! is a volunteer program where students, teachers, staff and alumni work together to foster Warrior Pride and get students to move to their new home. So, just as this year is a little different, WWC 2020 will take place over a whole week to a week's movement for housing and residential life. The WWC program and the move-in will be from Monday, August 24 to Saturday, August 29. Using suitable personal protective equipment (PPE), volunteers will use large trolleys to move items from cars to the residents' room, sanitising accordingly after each student helps. All volunteers must: complete the Warrior Safe training module before arriving on campus to voluntarily wear a face covering over their mouth and nose while on campus and volunteering with WWC - if you don't have your own, you will be provided with a practical 6ft physical distancing guidelines help with the sanitation of trolleys and other relocation equipment (sanitation supplies will be provided) as a , you must instruct others (families, students, etc.) to adhere to covid-19 mitigation strategies (including wearing a mask and remain physically distant) – Don't worry! We'll train you on this! All volunteers must complete the WWC Training Canvas online course before signing up for shifts and coming to campus to volunteer. Do I have to carry heavy boxes? Potentially! Most of our volunteers for the period 2020-2021 will take care of a cart and help only one student and his guest load the trolley and go to the room. After helping you unload the forklift, it will sanitise it and help the next student and guest. We will also have some volunteers strictly sanyant equipment or helping with voluntary check-in. How many hours do I have to commit? We are asking for a minimum of two 4-hour shifts throughout the week. Shifts should not be the same day that they overlap each other. What do I get out of it? The joy of welcoming the new Warriors into our community! Plus a hat and an official welcome warrior crew button. If I live on campus, can I move early? Yes! Volunteering must be done for a minimum of two-4 hours in two days throughout the week. You can move on to your fall assignment on Sunday, August 23 ahead of all other students. *Please note that you will only be able to move early if your autumn assignment is ready and ready. We will inform you in advance. How do I know what to do? It requires, asynchronous (own rhythm) virtual training for all WWC volunteers Monday, 17 August - Thursday, 20 August.
