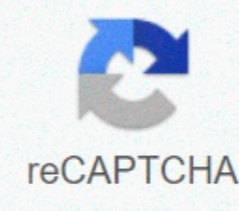

In line with this role, the ACS Trauma Commission (COT) is working to establish guidelines for the care of injured patients. Accordingly, COT sponsors and contributes to the continuation of the development of the Advanced Trauma Life Support Program (ATLS). The ATLS student course does not represent new concepts in the field of trauma care; instead, it teaches established methods of treatment. A systemic, concise approach to early care for trauma patients is a hallmark of the ATLS program. This Ninth Edition was developed for ACS by members of the ATLS Board and ACS COT, other individual fellows of the College, members of the international ATLS community, and non-surgical consultants on the Board who were selected for their specific competence in trauma care and medical education expertise. COT believes those individuals responsible for caring for injured patients will find the information extremely valuable. The principles of patient care presented in this manual may also be useful for the care of patients with non-mental illnesses. Injured patients present a wide range of complex problems. The ATLS student course is a concise approach to assessing and managing multiply injured patients. The course presents knowledge and techniques providers that are comprehensive and easily tailored to their needs. The skills described in this manual represent one safe way of performing each technique. The ACS recognizes that there are other acceptable approaches. However, the knowledge and skills taught in the course are easily adapted to all places of care for these patients. ATLS was developed by the American College of Surgeons (ACS) Trauma Board (COT), and was first introduced in the U.S. and abroad in 1980. His courses provide you with a safe and reliable method for the immediate management of injured patients. The course teaches you how to assess the patient's condition, revive and stabilize it, and determine whether its needs are greater than the capacity of the institution. It also covers how to arrange an inter-slip transfer of the patient and ensure that optimal care is provided throughout the process. If you don't often treat trauma patients, the ATLS course provides a simple memory method for evaluating and treating a trauma victim. All students of the student or student refresher course will receive a copy of the current Student Manual Advanced Trauma Life Support®(ATLS®). If you don't take ATLS manuals can still be purchased. How can I find an ATLS course? How long has ATLS student status been aut: After successfully completing an ATLS Student or Student Refresher course, your ATLS status is accumulative for four years from the last course date. Students have up to six months after their status expires to teach in a student refresher course. After this refresh time frame expires, you must retake the entire ATLS exchange rate. How do I find out if I have current ATLS provider status? Please contact your regional program coordinator before I have not yet received my PROVIDER ATLS card. Who should I answer to? Contact the coordinator of the page you signed up for the course with. How much continuous medical education (CME) and self-assessment points (MOC part 2) can be awarded after completing an ATLS course? 2.5-day student course – 20 CME credits; 20 self-reported points 2-day student course – 17 CME points; 17 self-assessment points 1-day student refresh course – 7.5 CME loans 0.5-day student refresh course – 5 CME points 2- and 1.5-day instructor courses – 9.5 CME loans 1-day instructor course – 8.25 CME points How can I get a new student card if mine is lost or damaged?
