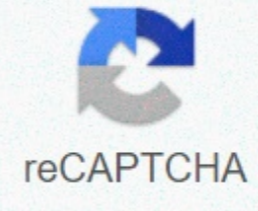

## Christ at the centre leicester

Thousands of people of all ages and cultures came to Leicester city centre to see the reconstruction of the last days of Jesus. Watch Christ in the center play about life and take a look at the pictures ... More than 80 actors and musicians staged a powerful performance of Good Friday in a play by a Christian drama group from Kibworth called SWORD Theatre Company. The drama of Christ in the Center is very powerful - even in rehearsal. James Burke-Dansmore, actor and director of Bank Holiday Good Friday was the fifth year the play took place in Leicester city centre. Around 10,000 people from Leicestershire and beyond witnessed the incident, which happened in different parts of the city centre. The procession began at Leicester Cathedral and passed to Town Hall Square, Greyfriars, Burridge Street and Horsefair Street before they drove to the final act of the performance. Actor and director James Burke-Dansmore plays the role of Christ for the third year in a row. He said: The drama of Christ in the Center is very powerful - even in rehearsal. While this may be the story of one person, it's certainly not a one-man show. James says the special nature of the play is largely due to the effort and commitment the rest of the cast put in to create the drama. The chirst at the drama centre unfolded from Leicester Cathedral at 10.15am. The arrest and courtroom scenes took place in Town Hall Square at 11.00. And the final scene of the crucifixion of Jesus Christ took place on the big stage at the Humberston Gate at 11:45. I can't wait for the sixth year! Jesus on the Cross - Leicester Christ at the centre of the presentation is probably the biggest dramatic presentation of The History of Easter in the UK. We hope this will lift your spirits and encourage you to join us in our weekly online worship and monthly evangelical services - ONLINE SERVICES Religious Education Classes were launched in 1977 and with a steady increase in membership; Members were asked to establish a prayer house in May 1978, electing staff members to perform various responsibilities. The Church Hall in Regent Road was rented for worship in 1979 and then membership was over 60. Church Meeting Committee decided to be responsible for finding suitable premises, as the constant meeting in the rented hall was inconvenient. In 1983, the number of members of the church grew to more than 100 people. After seeing an announcement in the newspaper that the church building on Humberstone Road was for sale, the building was subsequently acquired and repairs began. During the Spiritual Convocation of April 16-18, 1984, the Church in Leicester was established and dedicated for use by the Lord. The gathering place was later established for members of the Church in Peterborough, and regular visits were planned for the pastor of the Church in Great Yarmouth. As the number of RE students and members continued to grow, the existing building did not provide enough space for all church activities. In addition, the building was more than 100 years old and needed frequent maintenance, so the Church Council decided to look for new premises. The search turned out to be a long process. For more than 10 years, members in Leicester have looked at a number of buildings and even made offers to buy buildings that were considered appropriate but were not successful. The idea of renovating and expanding the existing building was also considered. However, members prayed persistently and continued to raise funds in the belief that God would give us the best in His time. Thank God, in 2010, a four-storey office building in the centre of Leicester came on the market, and after raising funds through the proposals and loans of church members and churches in the UK, the current church building was purchased in February 2011. The size of the building along with its own car park means that there is enough space for the church to grow. The church building is located near Leicester Railway Station and the University of Leicester, which not only makes it convenient for members, but also gives the church a more prominent place for evangelism. In order to reduce costs, much of the repair work was carried out by members who tirelessly and willingly gave their free time to complete the work. The first service on the Sabbath took place on October 13, 2012, and all members offered their heartfelt thanksgiving to God for His great blessing. With this new church building, God gave us the opportunity to serve Him more, both in pastoral and evangelical work. With the size of the building it is possible for Leicester Church to help with major national events. The Church continues to hold classes, scholarships, services and spiritual convocations, and assists in divine work in Peterborough, Great Yarmouth and Birmingham. At the end of 09/2013, Leicester has a membership of about 180. There are 5 deacons and one deacon. The Church Council consists of 9 members.
