Online design slcc online courses are offered in an eight-week enrollment period. Students enroll in one or two courses at a time and can initiate their online coursework at the beginning of any of the six enrollment periods per year. The minimum age gap required for students seeking an online degree allows them to take full advantage of an adult and vocational learning environment. St. Louis Christian College has been offering accredited degree programs to adult students for more than 20 years. Enrollment periods consist of semesters and modules. The year is divided into two semesters, with one beginning in January and another beginning in July. Each semester contains three 8-week modules. Students can start their online coursework at the beginning of any of the six modules (also called enrollment periods), but must accept the basics for academic excellence as a first year. Students can take up to 18.5 credit hours of regular work per semester to maximize their progress before completing a degree. Online students receive counseling from the online program coordinator to each semester to discuss learning progress and planning. For practical purposes, the terms enrollment and registration are synonymous. Initial registration is a simple process: First, fill out and submit an online application form on the college's website. You will be contacted by a member of the college enrollment team who will quide you through other steps. If you want to apply for federal financial assistance, follow the instructions on the college's website. Students choose between degree programs based on previous college work, if any, and general educational goals; it is important to discuss these issues with a member of the registration group. Entry requirements Online degree programs are intended for those 21 years and older. Applicants under the age of 21 can be admitted under certain conditions. Entrants must provide a high school diploma or its equivalent, personal links and ACT assessment for those who have graduated from secondary school within the past three years. Those who attended another college must submit a transcript of previous courses and a good standing affidavit (the form is available at the SLCC Academic Office). Full details of these requirements are published in the college catalog, available on the college's website. By law, international students The guest student open enrollment option is available to individuals, including students from other institutions wishing to take up to three online courses without working up to a degree at SLCC. Guest students do not qualify for federal financial aid. Technological requirements Online students must have adequate computer equipment and sufficient skills to be able to receive training through this medium. To participate in online classes you will need a computer and broadband connection. To help you communicate with the teacher and other students, access course materials, and send tasks on time, you'll need an email app or app like Outlook or Gmail.
