Hurston wrote *Their Eyes* in 1937 in just seven weeks while doing anthropological research in Haiti. When Zora Neale Hurston's *Their Eyes Were Watching God* was first published in 1937, it did not receive the praise and recognition it receives today. White readers were much less critical of the novel than black readers, who felt that Hurston had not been harsh enough in his criticism of the white treatment of blacks in the South. They felt she painted an overly rosy picture of black life in the South, betraying blacks by not depicting the abuse and demoralization they had suffered. In fact, one of the most prominent black writers and intellectuals of the late thirties, Richard Wright, said that their eyes were themeless and meaningless; he believed that by portraying his people as quaint, Hurston had exploited them. In the early 1970s, professors of African-American and women's literature rediscovered Hurston's novel and began teaching it to students. The book had been for many years, but newfound zeal for Hurston's work caused the book to be brought back into print only in 1971 and then permanently in 1975. Alice Walker (the author of *The Color Purple*) was instrumental in bringing their eyes looked god in the modern literary canon. She became Hurston's master, searched the south for Hurston's unmarked tomb, and signed it: Zora Neale Hurston, A Genius of the South. Walker's characterization of Hurston as a Southern writer was well founded. Although she was born in Alabama, Hurston grew up in Eatonville, Florida, the first all-black city in America. The city was founded by a man named Joe Clarke (who has a similar ring to her romance Joe Starks), who was eventually elected mayor. Just as city dwellers sitting on Joe Stark's shop porch in their eyes watching God, people would sit outside Joe Clarke's store porch and tell stories about their lives and jokes about their neighbors. Zora Neale Hurston was born in Notasulga, Alabama into a large family, the fifth of eight children. Three years after Hurston's birth, her family moved to Eatonville, Florida, one of the first all-black cities in the United States. Eatonville is of clear importance to Hurston, as it becomes a dominant environment in their eyes looked at God, and is often cited by Hurston as her birth place. Hurston joined Howard University in the South in 1918, but left in 1924 and was then offered a scholarship to Barnard College (part of Columbia University) in New York a year later in 1925. She received a bachelor's degree in anthropology in 1927, and at that time was 36 years old. She continued her postgraduate studies at Columbia in but did not complete her degree, but instead spent many years doing fieldwork in the Caribbean in the late 1920s and 1930s, while also working on her fiction. After the emancipation proclamation in 1863, many all-black cities began to appear in the South of the United States, and were soon officially incorporated into the nation. Eatonville, Florida is one such city, incorporated into the United States on August 15, 1887, and is known in particular as the hometown of Zora Neale Hurston. Given Hurston's political departure from the Harlem Renaissance, her works such as *Jonah's Gourd Vine* (1934) and *Moses, Man of the Mountain* (1939) – along with *Their Eyes Saw God* – are not seen as related

to the movement. Instead, because of her identity as a socially liberal Republican, showing feminist inclinations more than anything else, Hurston is often associated with the female, Libertarian writers Rose Wilder Lane and Isabel Paterson. When it was published: 1937 Literary Period: Hurston's work coincided historically with the Harlem Renaissance, although she is actually known for deviating with the politics and ideologies of many writers of the movement, including Langston Hughes, Richard Wright and Ralph Ellison. In particular, Huston identified as a Republican and spoke actively against many Harlem Renaissance writers supported by the New Deal and Communism. Genre: Novel Setting: The American South in the early 20th century. The novel is set most centrally in Eatonville, Florida and in the Everglades. Climax: The highlight of the novel is undoubtedly set in Chapter 18, during the Hurricane. It is in this scene that Janie and Tea Cake lie in clear resistance to the forces of nature, and find themselves fighting against God's will for survival. Antagonist: Janie's first two men, Logan Killicks and Jody Starks, are disrespectful and abusive partners, effectively placing them as Janie antagonists for the first half of the book. In the second half of the year, Mrs. Turner serves as an antagonist to both Tea Cake and Janie, expressing her racist views toward black people to both of them and alienating Tea Cake in particular by suggesting that Janie leave him for her lighter skinned brother. Viewpoint: The novel is Janie's life story, told Pheoby Watson by Janie himself. But throughout the novel, a third-person omniscient narrator interrupts Janie's narrations and direct presentations of the characters' speeches. The narrator's way of speaking is clearly literary in contrast to the southern dialect of the other characters, but is still influenced by the language and imagery of the characters and their world. Political Hurston famously spoke against the Supreme Court's Ruling Brown vs. Board of Education case (1954), arguing simply that segregation in schools does not prevent black children from receiving an equal education. This kind of attitude speaks to Hurston's right-leaning politics. Buy on BN.com Hurston title comes from Chapter 18 where Janie and Tea Cake take shelter from the raging hurricane. Hurston writes that they were waiting to see how nature would determine their fate: They seemed to stare at the darkness, but their eyes looked at God. With this line, the characters acknowledge the lack of control they have over their own lives, and realize that they can only be spared from cruelty in nature if God deems appropriate to save them.
