My spreadsheets faithfully recreate the format of the 1790-1930 U.S. Federal Census, as well as 1850-1860 slave schedules, 1850-1880 mortality schedules, 1883 pensioners list and 1890 veterans and widows' schedule. In addition to the federal spreadsheet I also have a collection of state census spreadsheets, which includes lowa 1836-1925, Kansas 1865-1925, Massachusetts 1855-1865, Minnesota 1849-1895, New Jersey 1855-1915, New York 1825-1925 and Wisconsin 1836-1905. Spreadsheets allow you to organize and save census passages electronically. They can also be used to print blank forms, especially useful for state census research, where extractive forms are simply not readily available. I offer all spreadsheet works for free.
