These standards define what students know and should be able to do. Based on a teaching and learning philosophy that is consistent with current research, exemplary practice, and national standards, the Standard Training Course is designed to support North Carolina teachers in providing the most challenging education for the state's students. The purpose of these standards is to prepare all students to become a career and college ready. With these standards as a basis, local school leaders are making decisions about a comprehensive curriculum that they choose to deliver to students so they can reach content standards for each class and subject. In addition, local schools and districts may offer electives and coursework that go beyond the nc Standard Course of Study standards. The Classroom Instruction is a partnership between the state that sets standards for content in the Standard Learning course and local teachers who determine what teaching materials they will use to deliver instructions to achieve standards. State Council on SCOS-012's policy defines the review, review and NC Standard Training Course (SCOS) (approved in March 2018). The five-to-seven-year cycle provides time for revision, revision and consistent implementation of standards. Reconciliation with the state evaluation program, expanded content standards and acceptance of materials will be reviewed throughout the process as needed.
