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## Aia change order form

A construction project is a liquid and a little unpredictable animal. Once the project is underway, it rarely goes according to plan. Owners may change their minds or unforeseen problems may occur. Changes are needed to ensure that the project is successfully completed. In order to avoid rewriting an entire contract, the order of change enables both parties to make changes in their speech. The American Institute of Architects (AIA) provides the AIA G701 Order Change Form, a standardized form to simplify this process. It is used together with other AIA documents as part of a standard payment application. This is a guide for each section of the AIA G701 Change Order.

What is the order of change in construction? A change order is a document that changes the scope of work in the contract. It can either add items to the scope of work or reduce it. The scope of the work is the part of the construction contract that determines the specific work, materials and/or services of the contract. The scope of the work lists all specific tasks and deadlines that the contractor agrees to perform. But things change all the time on a construction project. No one wants to rewrite the contract every time the owner wants to change something. This is where the orders for change come in. If the owner wants to make additions or deductions to the scope of the contractor's work, they can do so with a change order. When all parties agree to change an order, it legally changes the scope of the work according to the original contractual terms. Don't you need an AIA G701 Change order form? Select a change order template based on the type of construction contract you are working from (e.g. fixed amount, T&M). For documents of the AIA, the American Institute of Architects (AIA) is a professional organization that consists of over 90,000 licensed architects and other industry professionals. They are designed to be not only legal, but fair and flexible for all parties. The three most common documents will usually be used together as part of the salary application process. These include the AIA G701 Order Change, the AIA G702 application and payment certificate, and the AIA G703 continuation sheet.

AIA G701-2017 Order Change AIA order change as a written agreement used to implement changes in the work that describes the terms of the contract. the adjusted fixed amount of the contract or the guaranteed maximum price (GMP) and the adjusted execution time. This top section of the AIA G701 is where you will find all the information about the parties and the construction project itself. If you use the AIA payment application, the same header information will apply. Project: Specify the project name and the address or number of the plot. Contract information: Describe the work, materials, or services you provide on the project. Include the date on which the contract started. Change Order Information: Insert the change order number (if this is the first order to change this contract, put 01) and the date of the change line. Owner: Include the name and address of the project owner. Architect: Includes the name and address of the architect of the project. If an architect is not part of the project, it could be a GS or a project manager. Artist: Specify your name and address. AIA G701 Part II: Contract changes

This section begins the CONTRACT CHANGES AS FOLLOWS. Here you must describe any changes to the original contract. Include all the details of the proposed changes and the cost of each change. In more detail here, the better. It is important to be specific in the event of a payment dispute later on the details of the work. The best practice here is to include all and all applicable applications. They may include drawings, specifications and any other documents or particulars which clearly indicate that a change is expected to be made. AIA G701 Part III: Determining the change in cost and execution time

Now it's time to get to the bottom of it. This section will provide all previous accounting values and how the change in work will change the contract price. For tabs that have two or more options in parentheses, strike out those that do not apply.

1. The original contract/GMP Amount This is the original amount of the contract for the work. This number will be the same throughout the project, no matter how many change orders you have written. The AIA Change order form works for both a fixed price contract amount and a guaranteed maximum price value.

2. Net change from pre-authorized Order Changes

If this is the first change line of the job, this value will be 0. If this is the second line change or after, then this field will be the total value of the previous changes. Remember that this can be a positive or negative change, as some change orders are orders for changes in the landfill. Do not include changes made through the Building Change Directive unless all parties have later agreed to the change and recorded it as order for change.

3. The amount of the contract/GMP prior to this change add the two rows above this one. This value is the total amount of the original contract amount and the net change from the pre-authorized change orders. If you have the order to change the previous one, the amount in this section will correspond to the New Contract Amount from this document.

4. The contract amount will be increased/decreased/modified with this Order Change in the amount of This is where the total value of the current order change is recorded. This can be a positive or negative change. Sometimes it may not change costs at all. Regardless, this must correspond to a price that the owner or architect agreed to.

5. The new contract/GMP amount, including this change

invitation (or subtraction) of the two previous lines. This is the new contract amount or GMP of the contract after reporting the current order change.

6. Contract time will be increased / reduced / indifferent

Here, you will need to add how the order of change will affect the execution time (in cash days). In other words, how will the changes affect the material completion date? Will you finish early? Will it take more work? Or will you be done in time?

7. New due completion date

In the end, after determining the number of days that will be affected by the order of change, add or subtract this from the date of your contract significant closure. AIA G701 Part IV: Signatures section

Sely for change is a fundamental amendment to the original contract, so it must be signed by all relevant parties. It requires signatures from the contractor who agree to the changes, and the owner and architect order the changes. Also, for the purposes of record-keeping, the AIA G701 should also be printed and signed three times. Thus, each party has an original, executed copy to clarify any problem that may eventually come up later in the project. How much does the AIA G701 cost? AIA provides three different ways to purchase the AIA G701 order form, depending on whether you are an AIA member and the type of order change form you are looking for.
