I tried to pair again, but my computer can't find my headphones. I had just charged the headphones, so it's not like that. I tried Power Cycling both devices. Adjust the volume of your audio player. The music is playing, but the headphones are mute. Check the Aux port, make sure the device is connected correctly... If this is the response, read on. Try turning up the volume or using another audio player to see if the headphones are the real cause of the problem. If they still don't work, read on for other possible underlying causes. Run your fingers over the length of the aux cord, feeling for bumps or cracks in the wire casing. If there is a break in your aux cable, mark the break point and refer to the Aux Cord Replacement Guide. The music plays, but it is one-sided. If part of the Aux cable is damaged, it can easily be connected to a ... If there are no problems with the cable outside the device, the internal components may be defective. Expand the size slider and check the wires that pass through it to make sure they are intact. If this is not the guest, soldering is necessary. There is noise, but it sounds weird. Make sure that your device is fully connected to the audio source and is not affected by a phone case or other objects. I saw youtube on my iphone and all the noises stopped. I checked and my headphones were still connected. I opened my Bluetooth area in the settings, but then they parted. I hadn't pressed any buttons or turned off the headphones. I tried to reconnect them, but the charging circuit only as long as I leave it. I tried to turn off Bluetooth, my headphones and my phone, but it still won't connect. I also tried to connect them to my laptop, which was connected to them in the past, but it wouldn't connect either. Sometimes when I try to connect it on my phone, the circle turns for a few minutes, which says that the connection was not successful. The headphones are turned on and they still say pairing as soon as I turn them on, but they refuse to connect to anything. Any advice is welcome.
