Blaine milam wikipedia

Blaine Keith Milam's execution is scheduled for 6:00 pm CST, Tuesday, January 15, 2019, at the Walls Unit of the Huntsville State Penitentiary in Huntsville, Texas. 29-year-old Blaine is convicted of the murder of 13-month-old Amora Carson in Rusk County, Texas, in December 2008. Blaine's been on death row in Texas for the last eight years. Blaine didn't have a previous prison record. He dropped out of school after 4th grade and did not work at the time of his arrest, although he had worked previously. According to Blaine's mother, Blaine stopped maturing emotionally at the age of 12 and used methamphetamine off-and-on. Blaine took his father's death hard, tried twice to commit suicide. At the time of the murder, Blaine was on parole for aggravated sexual assault of a child under the age of 14. Blaine Milam and Jessica Carson met in January 2008, and got engaged on prom night. When they met, Jessica had recently had a child, Amora, with another man. Shortly after getting engaged, Carson moved in with Milam. At 10:37 a.m., on December 2, 2008, police received an emergency call from Milam. His first word was My name is Blaine Milam, and my daughter, I just found her dead. When the police arrived 20 minutes later, two ambulances were already on the scene. Police found EMTs standing in the bedroom door, where Milam and Carson knelt over an infant on the floor. The first officer found that the child was bruised and was not breathing or moving. Another cop arrived and Milam and Carson were separated for questioning. Milam told police that the couple had left the child asleep to go up the road to talk to a man about clearing some land for them. On his return, about an hour later, Milam stated that they found the child in that condition. Milam cooperated with the police and consented to search of his car and home. Milam was then interviewed by a Texas Ranger, in which he claimed that they had found Amora in a hole in the bathroom floor, which was being rebuilt, and that Amora was still alive when he called the police. Milam later changed her story and said that Carson called the police before they had found the child, and that when they found her, she was dead. Milam denied any involvement in Amora's death. At the end of their conversation, the Texas Ranger considered Milam a suspect. Ranger also interviewed Carson, who first cried and acts very upset before drastically changing her demeanor. She began referring to Amora as that child, and told Ranger a story he described as extremely bizarre. When police spoke to the man Milam and Carson said they had met that morning, he denied any meeting with them on December 2. Furthermore, video surveillance the couple had visited a pawnshop, and pawned 2 items. Milam's sister received a phone call from around 9:30 a.m., where Milam said he had found Amora dead. A search of the trailer revealed extensive DNA evidence, making it highly unlikely that Amora was killed elsewhere. In addition, the police received a tip from Milam's family, after his sister visited him in prison, that there was more evidence under the trailer. Police obtained a search warrant and discovered more evidence that matched previously discovered evidence. The coroner in the case testified that the damage to Amora was extensive, which made it impossible to determine an exact cause of death. Many of the injuries would have been fatal on their own. Many bite marks were also discovered on Amora's body. An expert could testify with a reasonable degree of dental certainty that a number of the bite marks came from Milam. Carson was excluded from all but 1 of the bite marks. Milam's brother was also tested. He didn't match any of the bite marks. During Milam's trial, his lawyers focused on Carson as the killer. Milam's trial had to be moved from Rusk County, where the murder occurred, to Montgomery County because of the notoriety of the case. In May 2010, Milam was found guilty of capital murder and sentenced to death. 1 year later, Carson was also found guilty and sentenced to life in prison without the possibility of parole. During Carson's trial, she claimed Milam was controlling and violent. In addition, she claimed that milam at the time of Amora's death performed an exorcism on the girl.
