Born and raised in Philadelphia, Hart began his career by winning several amateur comedy competitions in clubs across New England, culminating in his first real break in 2001, when he was cast by Judd Apatow for a recurring role in the tv series *Undeclared*. The series lasted only one season, but soon landed other roles in such films as *Paper Soldiers* (2002), *Scary Movie 3* (2003), *Soul Plane* (2004), *In the Mix* (2005) and *Little Fockers* (2010). Hart's comedic reputation continued to grow with the release of his first stand-up album *I'm a Grown Little Man* (2008) and appearances in *think like a man* (2012), *Grudge Match* (2013), *Ride Along* (2014) and its sequel *Ride Along 2* (2016), *About Last Night* (2014), *Get Hard* (2015), *Central Intelligence* (2016), *The Secret Life of Pets* (2016), *Captain Underpants : The First Epic Film* (2017) , *Jumanji: Welcome to the Jungle* (2017), *Night School* (2018) and *Jumanji: Next Level* (2019). He also released four more comedy albums, *Seriously Funny* in 2010, *Laugh at My Pain* in 2011, *Let Me Explain* in 2013 and *What Now?* In 2016, *Time Magazine* named Hart one of the 100 most influential people in the world on the annual *Time 100* list. He starred in the role of real-life Hollywood husbands. In 2017, Hart launched *Laugh Out Loud Network*, a subscription video streaming service in partnership with Lionsgate. Hart was born on July 6, 1979, in Philadelphia. He was raised in a single-parent household by his mother Nancy Hart, who was a systems analyst at the Office of Student Enrollment and Financial Services at the University of Pennsylvania. He has an older brother, Robert. His father, Henry Witherspoon, was a cocaine addict who spent most of Kevin's childhood in prison, and Kevin used humor as a way to deal with his troubled family life. He is a Christian. After graduating from George Washington High School, Hart briefly attended College of Philadelphia and moved to New York. [8] [9] He then moved to Brockton, Massachusetts, and found a job as a shoe salesman. He began his career in stand-up comedy after performing in an amateur club in Philadelphia. Hart's first stand-up concert was held at The Laff House in Philadelphia under the name Lil Kev, which didn't go well. His career took a slow start because he was booed several times from the stage, once even having a piece of chicken thrown at him. After those first failed performances, Hart began competing in comedy competitions across Massachusetts, and the audience eventually improved. Hart needed time to develop a unique comedic style. After an early period of trying to emulate comedians such as Chris Tucker, he found his own rhythm, delving into his insecurities and life experiences. Because of what I do, it has to be an open book, he said. But now it is a book that is written. Hart's comedy tours began in 2009 with his act titled *I'm a Grown Little Man*, followed by *Seriously Funny* in 2010, *Laugh at My Pain* in 2011 and *Let Me Explain* in 2013, two of which were also released as features in theaters. Hart earned more than \$15 million with *Laugh at My Pain*, making it one of the best-selling comedy tracks of the year. On April 9, 2015, Hart embarked on a world tour titled *What Now? Tour* at &at&at Center in San Antonio, which ended August 7, 2016 at the Columbus Civic Center in Columbus, Georgia. On July 16, 2015, Universal Pictures announced that Kevin Hart: *What Now?*, a stand-up comedy starring Kevin Hart's performance of *What Now?* The tour will be released in the United States on October 14, 2016. The series was filmed live on August 30, 2015 at Lincoln Financial Field in Philadelphia. [17] In film and television roles, Hart made a guest starring in *Undeclared*. He made his film debut in *Paper Soldiers*. Hart gained further recognition with other films such as *Scary Movie*, *Soul Plane*, *The 40-Year-Old Virgin*, *Death at a Funeral* and *Little Fockers*.
