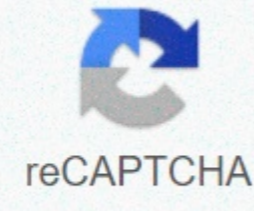

He's best known for the singles That's On Me,[3] Bacc at It Again,[4] Up One and Goin Through Some Thangs. Early life and career Conway was raised in the Oak Rock neighborhood of Dallas, TX. When Conway was 12, his father was killed at their home on Oak Rock on Mother's Day. As a child, he played basketball and football, and his primary goal was to become a professional footballer. [6] Conway became Crip[7] in adolescence and sold drugs to support his family. [8] He was often kicked out of school for a fight and eventually dropped out of high school without a diploma. [9] 2017-present: Yella Breezy performs at the 2018 concert. Conway began writing lyrics and rapping at the age of 13. It was inspired by artists such as Boosie Badazz and Kevin Gates. At the age of 14 he released his first mixtape, Mash Mode Overload. His second mixtape, Lil Yella Mane, was released in 2012. Conway's first hit single came in 2015 with Trap in Designer from his mixtape Broke Nights in Rich Days. [6] In 2017, Yella Beezy released her mixtape Lite Work, Vol. 2. It featured the song That's On Me, which peaked at 37 on the Billboard Hot 100 and also prompted Yella Beezy
