Lula Lula is African-American with a dislike of white people. She doesn't like the idea of Calpurnia bringing atticus Finch, Jem and Scout's kids with her to church and telling her that, but she's outvoted by other congregants. According to Calpurnia's son Zeebo, Lula said that, troublemaker since ancient times, with fancy ideas and haughty ways. She threatens to be in the church (subjected to church discipline) by Reverend Sykes. Mrs Grace Merriweather, Mrs. Grace Merriweather. Merriweather is the producer of a play in which Scout plays like a ham. She tells Everett that the ladies of the South Maycomb Alabama Methodist Episcopal Church are 100 percent behind him. She is mostly known for her devotion to the church and is widely held as the most devout lady in Maycomb; however, like many of her peers, she is very hypocritical and likes to gossip with all other women. Walter Cunningham Jr. Walter Cunningham Jr. is a kid who's almost as old as Jem, but he's in Scout's class. He lives on a farm. He's too poor to even pay off a 25-cent debt because the Great Depression hit his poor family hard. He doesn't take money because his family can't pay people back in cash. His father paid Atticus for his service for something a while ago with some merchandise. Walter was once invited to Finches' house, after they got into a fight with Scout, where he covered all his dinners with melas, to Scout's vocal astonishment. It teaches Scout a lesson in humility and compassion. Walter Cunningham Sr. Walter Cunningham is the elder father of Walter Cunningham Jr. He only appears twice, once at the beginning of the story when he has to pay off a debt to Atticus (Walter Cunningham Sr. was his client) by giving him firewood, vegetables and other supplies. He also runs a mob that comes to lynching Tom Robinson the night before the trial. It's only when Scout talks to him about his son and how much he owes Atticus that he changes his mind and he's working with the Mob. Scout reminds him of all the things Atticus has done for him and how he knows his son Walter Cunningham Jr., which is why Walter disbands the lynch mob and everyone goes home. After sentencing at the trial, Atticus tells Jem that one of Cunningham's changed his mind about Tom and pleaded not guilty to the jury. Walter Cunningham Sr. is an honorable but poor man, and after interacting with Scout, realizes it's not right to hurt people. Little Chuck Little Chuck Little is a student in Scout's first grade who has an adult mindset. His real name is Charles. He is portrayed as Burris Ewell's chief antagonist. It is presented in the novel when Miss Caroline is afraid of Burris' ears. He warned Miss Caroline that if Burris was not released from class, he could try something that would put their classmates at risk. When Burris starts advancing on Little Chuck after his warning/veiled insult, little Chuck's hand moved into his pocket (meaning he'll pull out a knife) as he said: Watch your step, Burris. I'm about to kill you while I look at you. Now go home. Frightened by little Chuck's courage and his implied knife, Burris retreats. We see through the narrative view of Scout, his gentlemanly attitude, and how it soothes Ms. Caroline. Little Chuck may even be more intelligent than he originally encounters the eye, as he is He could have bluffed about the implied knife to scare Burris into backing off. Mr. Avery, the obese Mr. Avery is boarding across the street from Mrs. Henry Lafayette Dubose's house. He tells Jem and Scout that the dramatic changes in weather are caused by unheeded and bad children. Jem watched Avery urinate from the porch in an impressive bow. After it snows, they build a snowman that will resemble him. Atticus disapproved of the snowman, so the children made her look like Miss Maudie. Mr. Avery pushed the mattress out the window when Ms. Maudie's house caught fire. Ms Gates, Miss Gates, a third-grade scout school teacher, argues that America is not as prejudiced as Hitler's Germany. Despite this, Scout overheard her saying that black people should be maued after Tom's trial. Her dual nature of hatred of Hitler and his prejudices while at the same time being prejudiced against African-Americans in her own community illustrates the hypocrisy present in Maycomb. Eula May Eula May is Maycomb's most prominent telephone operator. It sends public announcements, invitations and triggers a fire alarm. She announced the closure of schools when it snows and announced a rabid dog entering Maycomb. Her job allows her to know everyone in town. Cecil Jacobs Cecil Jacobs teases Scout and Jem at school. Scout almost got into a fight with Cecil over tom robinson's trial. Scout beats Cecil Jacobs because he says Atticus is a lover. He holds an immediate presentation of events about Adolf Hitler and later scares Scout and Jem on his way to the Halloween election. He and Scout then pair up at the carnival. It hints that black people are not as good as whites as they talk about Hitler during current events. Tim Johnson Tim Johnson is a dog belonging to Harry Johnson (a character in a book mentioned once but never seen). He's infected with rabies in Chapter 10 and goes crazy, dooming everyone in the city into danger. Atticus is forced to shoot Tim Johnson before he reaches Radley House or attacks anyone. When Atticus shoots a dog, his excellent shooting is revealed to Scout and Jem (his nickname was once One-Shot Finch). Zeebo collects the dog's body. Simon Finch Simon Finch is the founder of Finch's Landing. It is mentioned in the first chapter of the book, as a direct ancestor of Atticus. He is a Cornish Methodist and immigrated from England to escape religious persecution, landing in Philadelphia before settling in Alabama. He was married, with one son, eight daughters. He's also a pharmacist. Maxwell Green Maxwell Green is the new lawyer in town. He's usually a court-appointed defense attorney but Judge Taylor assigned Tom Robinson's case to Atticus to give Tom Robinson a better chance. Mr X Billups Mr X Billups who has only been seen once in going to trial, he's described as a funny man. X is his name, not his initial. He was repeatedly asked his name until he signed it. X is the name he got when he was born because his parents marked his birth certificate with an X instead of a name. The barber sisters (Miss Tutti and Miss Frutti) The Barber Sisters (Miss Sarah, nicknamed Tutti and Miss Frances, nicknamed Frutti) are virgin sisters who live in the only houses in Maycomb with a basement. They are originally from Clanton, Alabama; and rumor has it they're Republicans. In addition to the Yankee way, both sisters are deaf (Tutti completely deaf; Frutti used an aushb) and had a Halloween prank pulled on them by some vicious schoolboys (Scout claims she wasn't involved) who put all their furniture in their basement. Mrs Gertrude Farrow Mrs Farrow is a lady in a missionary society who occasionally visits Finch House. Mr. Conner Mr. Conner was mentioned early in the book. Boo Radley and his friends put him in the bathroom. After taking the teenagers to court, Mr Conner accused them of disorderly conduct, disturbing public order, assault and abuse and using offensive and profane language in the presence and hearing of a woman. He added the latest charge after claiming the teenagers cursed so loudly that he was sure every lady in Maycomb could hear them. Zeebo Calpurnia taught her son, Zeebo, how to read. Zeebo is one of only four people in the Church of first purchase who can read, so he is a vocal leader, leading hymns in their church with lining—reading the verse and being repeated by the congregation. He's the garbage man who took the dead angry dog, Tim Johnson. When Lula, a fellow church member tries to make Scout and Jem feel bad about being in church with Calpurnia, Zeebo welcomes them with open arms.
