Los Angeles Harbor College (LAHC) is part of the Los Angeles Community College District. The College offers two different nursing programs. The first is the usual ADN program, which helps those already licensed as LVNs to promote their nursing qualifications. LAHC offers advanced placement for members of the Also. The ADN program at LAHC offers simultaneous classroomand clinical experience at a variety of local hospitals and clinics. Students can attend clinical studies at Kaiser Medical Center, Providence Little Company of Mary, Torrance Memorial Hospital, and Harbor UCLA, to name a few. The program is four semesters in length and takes two years to complete. During the course of the program you will participate in a variety of discussions in small groups and gain simulated laboratory experience. The curriculum includes courses such as nursing, communication in nursing, nursing process & amp; internship in care of children, an introduction to leadership & amp; management and more. You can also apply for the Family Nursing Scholarship Program, which is unique to the Los Angeles Community College District, until 2024. This scholarship covers not only the cost of supplies and license fees, Saddleback College is part of the South Orange County Community College district. and it offers a top notch ADN program. Saddleback College really focuses on the student by offering not only education, but also guidance, counseling, child care, a student health center, financial support, tutoring, and an excellent career center. Saddleback College's ADN program takes four semesters to complete, and you will be required to work two to three unpaid 12-hour shifts along with a signed RN during the evening. This will help you get your 240 required clinical hours. Classroom course work includes Pharmacology, Fundamentals of Aging, Nursing Process, Mental Health Nursing, Medical-Surgical Nursing, and more. Once you have completed this accredited nursing program, you will be eligible to sit for the NCLEX-RN survey. Per the school's nursing student achievement data from the academic year 2015-2016, 85% of all graduates got a job in the nursing field after graduation. Monterey Peninsula College (MPC) trains nurses at Maurine Church Coburn School of Nursing. Here you will earn an Associate of Science degree that successfully prepares you in nursing. The ADN program is offered in collaboration with Montage Health, Community Hospital in the Monterey Peninsula. MPC provides a combination of both classroom and clinical training to prepare you for your career. This program takes four semesters to complete, and you will take courses like General Human Anatomy, Lifespan Development, Interpersonal Communication, Applied Foundations of Learning, and more. Out of 73 total units distributed over the course of four semesters, four of these units are your clinical rotation. Completing the MPC ADN program in CA prepares you to sit for the NCLEX-RN exam and work as an RN in an entry-level position. The School of Nursing at Santa Barbara City College (SBCC) offers several unique opportunities for those interested in a nursing career, including an outstanding ADN program. program is four semesters in length and takes you two years year Complete. The curriculum is structured in such a way that it meets standards set by the Massachusetts Nurse of the Future and Quality and Safety Education for Nurses (QSEN). Courses you will take during the program include foundations in nursing, pharmacology, medical-surgical nursing, gerontology, community health care, and much more. Palomar College in San Marcos, California offers a highly rated nursing education program that takes a holistic approach to learning.
