Therefore, specific rules and procedures apply to O'ahu camping. There is no campsite available in state parks in Oahu on Wednesday and Thursday night. Sand Island State Park is only open for camping from Friday to Sunday evenings. O'ahu camping permits can be applied for no more than 30 days in advance. The campsite is offered in four O'ahu parks. All opportunities are for tent camping with simply developed camping. Some parks or campsites allow for shorter maximum stays. After that, you or anyone listed on your license should wait 30 days before staying overnight again in the same park. Licensees are allowed to book no more than one campsite or cabin in any particular park at a time. Rental of cabins or campsites for commercial uses is prohibited except for the special license. Campgrounds, caravans and trailers Hawaii's State Park campsites are not set up for camping in vehicles, campers, trucks and trailers. Therefore, we are not allowed to sleep in vehicles in the parking lots of our campsite. The only exception to this rule is at Wai'anapapa State Park in Maui, which has a small area reserved for caravans. Hawaii's Camp Life is based on Oahu Island. The airport is located in Honolulu (HNL). We have free pick-ups tools daily near downtown Honolulu or can delivery or from the airport at an additional cost of \$15. Current Pick-up and Drop off times: Sunday to Saturday 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.All camping on Oahu require a permit. Book your campsite before renting gear (best booking dates 14-30 days in advance). It allows range (-\$6-\$200) in price depending on Hawaii state residence, agency, and type. The easiest way to book a permit is to select the campsite on the map and follow the link to the booking website. On holidays or special events such as Wandertlust, Ragnar, Regattas, Festivals, Kaimana Klassic, Hopu, etc., campsites are often booked on the day they become available. To insure campsites during this period, be prepared to be on the computer during the day and time when camping becomes available. There are no walks in campgrounds, but you can also walk-in malaekahana beach campground, however they also receive 24 hours a day, 7 days a week online reservations. Most campgrounds require you to book online at least 7 days in advance so you don't forget to add this to your list to do! When considering camping, make sure to note which ones have gates locked overnight, while this increases security, can also delay what time you are able to leave in the morning or how late you can arrive at night. You may be surprised to find that heavy traffic is a key fixture in Oahu. Oahu is the most densely populated island and one of the smallest. There are few great roads and more cars than you can picture. I recommend playing it safe and planning a major activity per day. It is possible to schedule smaller activities that are close to each other and do not include driving during rush hour (6a.m.-9 a.m. & 2:30-6:30 p.m.). Knowing this can save you hours from sitting in traffic and missing appointment hours! Da bus is a great way to get around, but it will require some good planning! Uber, Lyft and taxis are available in Oahu. Except for all those fun things, O'ahu has everything. It has both a nightlife and sleepy towns away from Honolulu. Search for a campsite from the service. There are four different services and 22 campsites with allowed campsites. Honolulu City and County Honolulu City and County has campsites and 225 campsites. The campgrounds are either 3 days or 5 days reservations at \$32 and \$52 for the entire stay. Camping reservations go up at exactly 17:00 on Friday and can be fully booked until 17:01.m. Date of visit (January 20) Stayed at Camping #6 Like many campsites in Oahu the campsites were very close together. We were lucky and there weren't many campers in the park after 8pm however, during the day this regional park gets very crowded with weekend activities, parties and tourists. The Kuala A site is hidden away from the huge crowds there to see Gat's Chinamans and is a nice spot to hear the waves gently crash against the coastline. Bathrooms worked, showers were very cold (expected), and there is a nice sink outside the toilets to scrub dishes. I'll stay here again. Beach Front Sites This campsite is beautiful. The best locations are waterfront. You have to book early, good locations go very fast! The campsite is only open Friday-Monday. The campgrounds are large and this makes it nice, because sometimes it can be filled. There's plenty of shade too! I've camped here twice and I'll be back the next time I'm in Oahu. Bellows Camping Beach is a military recreation facility on the Windward side of Oahu near the town of Waimanalo. Bellows has a section open to the public and a military site that requires a U.S. government ID and window stickers. Camping is one of the highest rated beaches on Waimanalo Beach in the USA. The white sandy beach is a local favorite and must see while you are in Oahu. You can visit during the day or stay at the campsite. The campsite is for tent campers for individuals or large groups. You're going to have to come. Come. Friday to get a seat for the weekend. During the holidays you can expect large crowds. We like to go here during the week and get a section of the beach for ourselves. Surfing here is not great, since the reef is not along the coastline.
