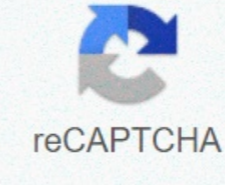

There is a lesson in spiritual warfare that has hurt people because they praised the devil's power so much that they taught people to fear the devil instead of fearing the Lord. So pointless victims of war are a real problem, but suggesting that Christians have no power over princes is not a saint's problem, or a healthy conclusion. Anyone who has read this should consider Annacondia, who began her crusade by speaking directly to Satan, saying, Listen to me Satan! You're letting these people go!
